GOLD BEACH — 4-H Summer Scholarships were awarded to 36 4-H club members last Saturday by the Curry County 4-H scholarship committee, which met at the county extension office.

The committee reviewed applications from all of the 4-Hers who applied for scholarships and awarded them to those who had made the most progress in their 4-H work, according to Clifford Jenkins, county agent. In scoring the applications, the committee considered the years of club work completed, activities participated in, 4-H offices held, community activities, other than 4-H, quality of work and the recommendations of the local leaders. In addition to the delegates, alternates were selected in case some of the delegates were unable to use their scholarship.

In addition to the scholarship, the club member is required to pay \$9.00 to cover cost of transportation and part of the cost at Corvallis.

The delegates will leave Curry county on the morning of June 12, going to summer school in a school bus provided by the Brookings school board. Delegates are being sent a list of things to take and cards to sign for special activities while on the OSC campus.
