When we first came to Weedy Acres we had a nostalgia for the flowers we once grew in Maryland and it seemed quite unbelievable that in this mild climate they would not flourish. But we have a very tricky climate here and newcomers with green thumbs will do well to heed the advice of gardening neighbors. It can save you lots of money!

We were discussing the vagaries of our coastal climate last Sunday when four of us were visiting a very lovely garden about a mile inland. Two of us were coast gardeners and we found some interesting differences in our gardens. Said the other lady who gardens overlooking the Pacific, "see, she still has ixias blooming here, while ours have long since blossomed and the spear-like leaves are already drying up." This is because Spring comes earlier on the ocean front, our winters are warmer. We agreed to this. But if spring comes earlier it is just the opposite with summer, for back from the ocean, toma-

toes and corn ripen better, and in the garden tour last Sunday, flowers were in bloom which in my garden show buds.

Watch your gardening neighbors and heed their advice! And if you have come from over the mountain, don't try to grow the same things you did elsewhere without first determining climate and soil conditions.

You will find here, a wealth of beautiful evergreen, blooming shrubs, and many flowers make gardening a joy. Be content with these.

Plant first of all a windbreak. There are many native shrubs and trees which can be used for this as well as others. Port Orford cedar, mugho pine, ceanothus, privet, veronicas, escallonia, to mention a few.

You will also be surprised to find that many flowers which you regarded as annuals elsewhere, seed themselves and require little attention here. Coreopsis, which the birds love, come up year after year, and once get nasturtiums growing, and they take care of themselves.

Gardening is fun here. An intimate gave me, recently, an article about the secret of the "green thumb." It seems that it simply means that you must truly love to raise things, and take an almost maternal interest in our tender, young growing plants.

es between Florence and Reedsport, Ten Mile lake north of North Bend, Garrison, Floras and Mercer lakes—all on the coast, are among the coastal waters. Fish in these lakes take flies, bait and spinner the year thru.

Surf and Deep Sea Fishing—off the rocks and in the breakers throughout the year is constantly gaining in popularity on the Oregon coast. Fishing the open beach surf requires rather heavy rods, reel and line to get sinkers and bait out there where the bigger ones are to be found. Chunks of clam, mussel, worms, and other baits easily obtained along the ocean are used to take these salt-water fish. Fishing from the rocky points along the coast, where the ocean is always thundering into chasms of the headlands is simpler. Long bamboo poles, casting rods—in fact, almost any type of tackle is employed. Deep-sea sport fishing boats are available at many points to take you off-shore to catch salmon, tuna, red snapper and sea bass.

Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 17 of Curry County, State of Oregon, from 8 p. m. to 9 p. m. on June 28, 1951, at Brookings school house, in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year 1951-1952 over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: The necessary expense of operating the school exceeds the amount equalized by the Rural School Board.

The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said fiscal year is \$7,714.90.
