

### Pelicans Swamp Reedsport, 10 - 1, In Sunday's Tilt

The Brookings Pelicans "flew" up the coast on Sunday and literally swamped the Reedsport club by a 10 to 1 score, making it two wins and no losses for the young Southwestern Oregon league season.

Big Bill Hanauska, ex-Willamette University and ex-Brooklyn Dodgers farm hand, was in superb form, holding his former mates of last season to only two hits. An error in the last of the ninth and Bill's first walks of the game cost him the shut-out.

The game started as a real pitchers' battle, with nine men on each team being retired in order for the first three innings. In the fourth, however, the Pelicans got the range on Burt, Reedsport's starting pitcher.

Matson as first up was safe on an error. Carlyle Staab, short-stop, then singled as did Bo Clingman, catcher, the latter driving Matson across the plate. Hank Westbrook, playing first base for the Pelicans then belted a long home run over the center-field fence to score Staab and Clingman ahead of him. Reedsport fans remarked this to be one of the longest homers ever hit in that park.

Brookings scored three runs in the top of the fifth on singles by Johnson, Matson and Clingman and a double by Hank Westbrook.

The Pels eighth run came in the seventh as Johnson and Matson both started the inning with singles. Manager Whitey was forced at second on Staab's ground ball, with Johnson going to third. Johnson and Staab then executed a double steal on Chuck Bafaro, Reedsport receiver, and Johnson crossed the plate standing up.

Bill McLean and Whitey Matson scored the final two Brookings runs in the ninth as Hank Westbrook drove them across the pan with his third extra-base hit of the game, another two-bagger.

Leading hitters of the day for Brookings were Matson and Bo Clingman with two for four, Johnson three for four, Staab two for five and Hank Westbrook three for five. Hank's trio of extra-base blows netted him six runs batted in.

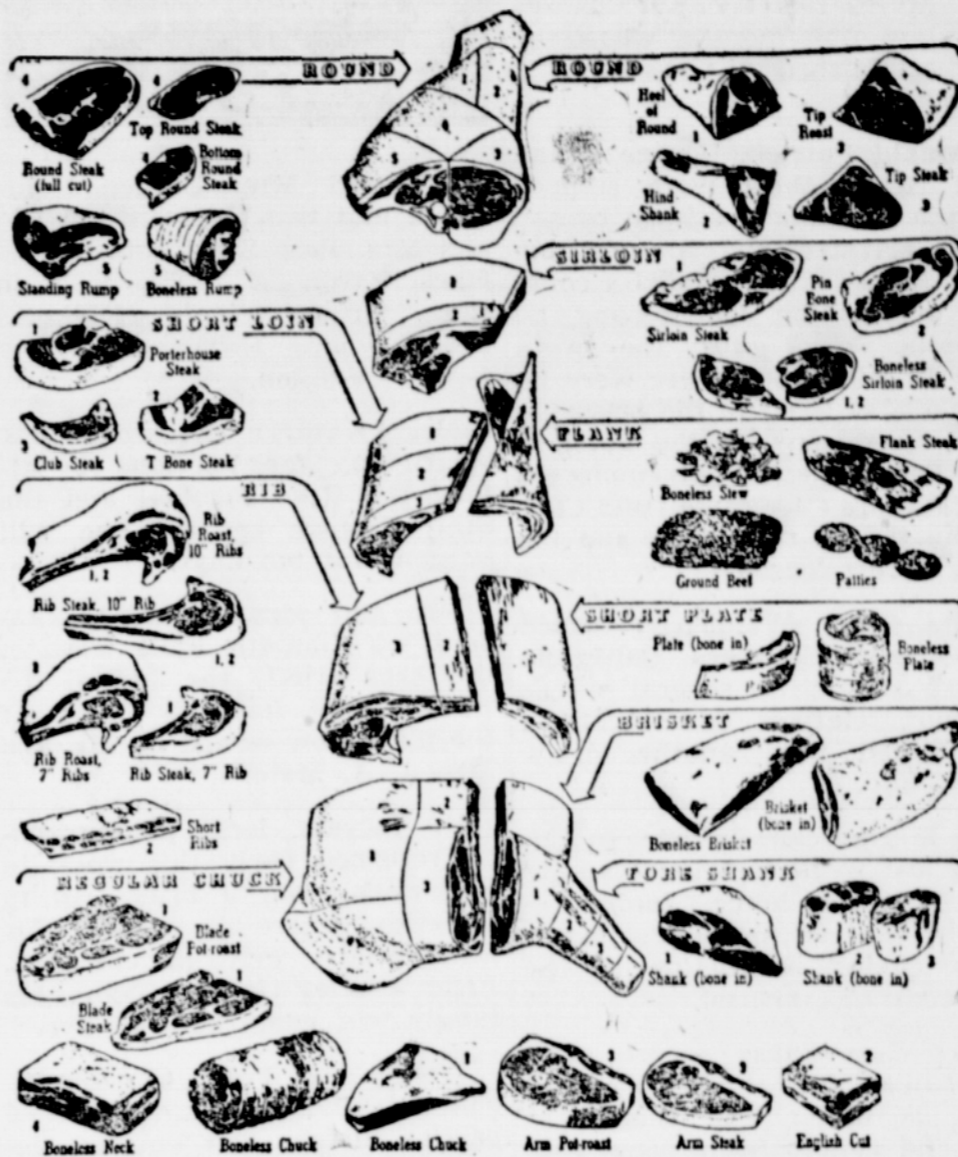

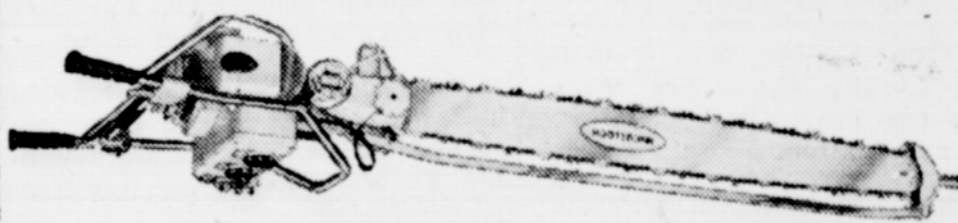

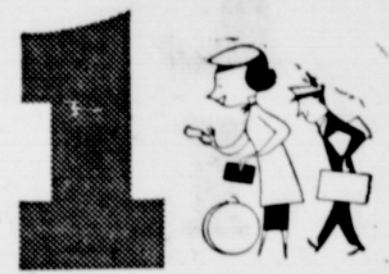
