Mrs. Waterman felt on April 19 that she was destitute after the fire but on June 3, she found she was infinitely wealthy, her friends and their acts were priceless.

### O. S. C. Graduate John W. Dawson

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis.—John William Dawson of Brookings is among the 1465 seniors and graduate students to receive degrees at the 82nd annual commencement exercises at Oregon State college June 4.

A record-breaking number of 218 advanced degrees will be conferred by President A. L. Strand. Of this number, 22 are doctors of philosophy and seven doctors of education another new record in the number of doctor's degrees conferred in one year.

A total of 1247 bachelors of science and bachelors of arts degrees, representing four full years of study will also be conferred. In addition to the doctorates, advanced degrees will include 135 masters of science, 12 masters of arts, 33 masters of education, 3 masters of home economics, two masters of forestry and four professional engineering degrees.

Dr. Leonard Odiorne pastor of the Westminster Presbyterian church, will deliver the baccalaureate sermon Sunday morning, June 3. Alumni will return for class reunions all day Saturday.

Dawson will receive a master of science degree, with a major in geology and a minor in paleontology.

### Greyhound Offers 'Package' Trips

Glen G Magnuson general traffic manager of Pacific Greyhound Lines announced this week that during 1950 Greyhound Highway Tours directed more than \$500,000 in gross business to hotels, resorts and sightseeing companies in territory served by Pacific Greyhound Lines.

Pacific Greyhound Lines operates in California, Oregon, Nevada, New Mexico, Arizona, and Utah.

"Naturally, tourists directed to hotels, resorts and sightseeing companies within a particular area, Magnuson said, "also benefit many other places of business within the area."

The bus official explained that the figure of \$518,212.60 does not include money spent by passengers while traveling by Greyhound on trips other than the Highway Tours. "Obviously, such a figure would be difficult to estimate"

Magnuson said, "but it must certainly be a sizable one."

He described the Highway Tour's as pre-planned and expense-paid, including transportation, sight-seeing and hotels accommodations, in addition to meals in some cases. "Thousands of such tours throughout the territory served by Pacific Greyhound are taken annually by tourist from all over the world," Magnuson said.

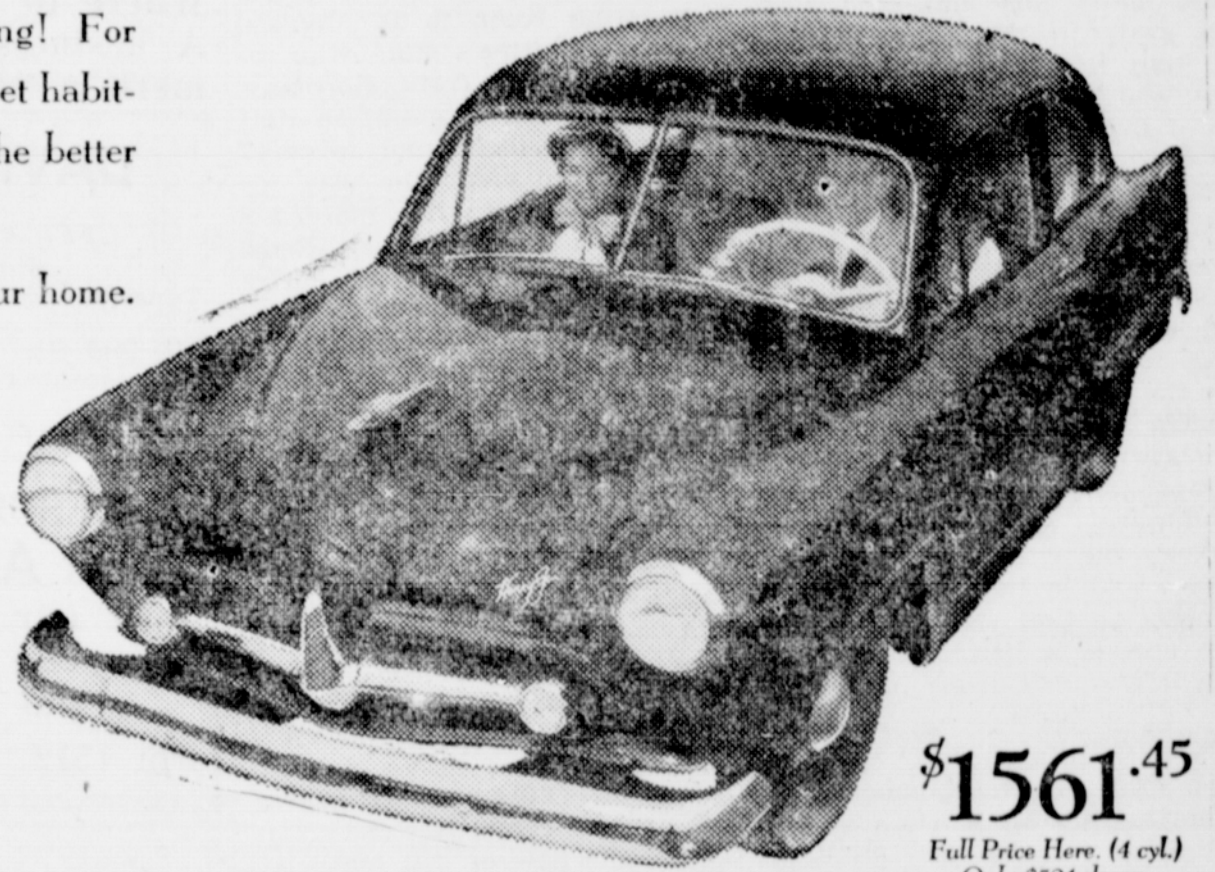

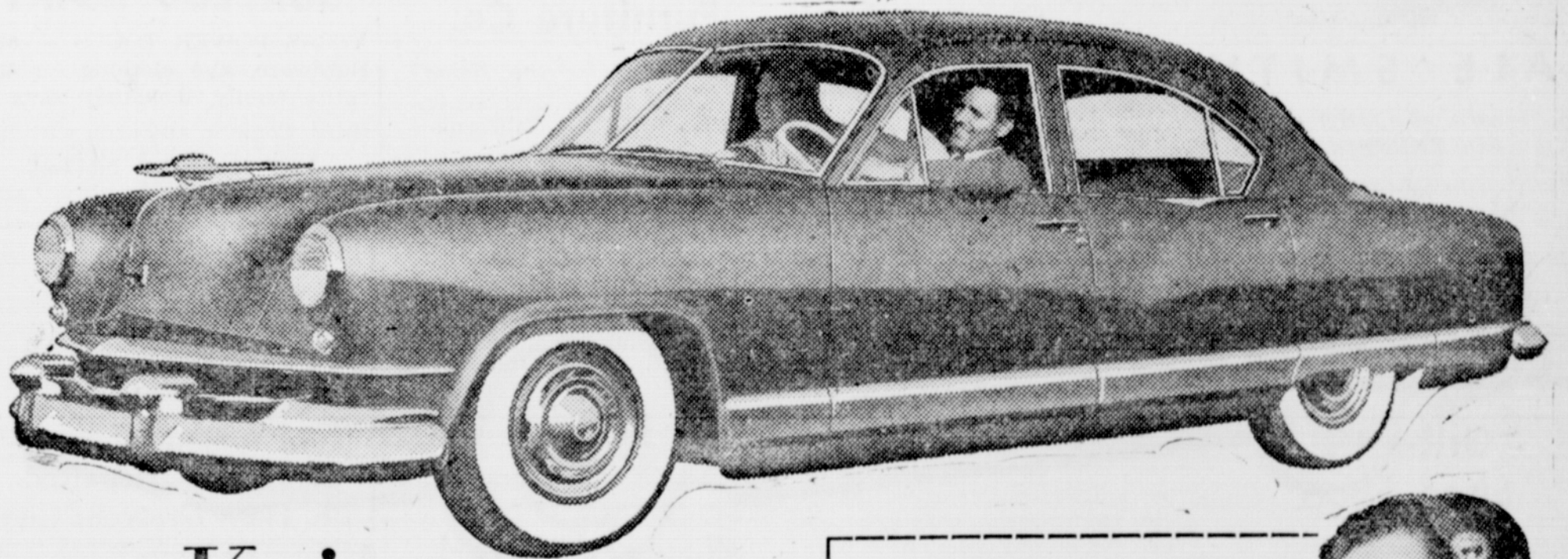
