

Pelicans Make It Three-In-A-Row, Sun., When Nierman Hurls 4-Hitter, 7 To 1

Behind 4-hit pitching of Nierman, Brookings Pelicans slammed the door in the face of Myrtle Creek on the local grounds, Sunday, 7 to 1. Nierman was deprived of a shutout in the sixth when he and his teammates gave Myrtle Creek their lone tally without a hit.

With Nierman untouchable the visitors went down 1-2-3 in the first inning to set the stage for Brookings scoring in the last of the first inning. Kimura walked, was forced at second by Johnson, Matson followed with a hot single through short with Johnson going to second. Polando was given a life by the third baseman's error and Johnson scored. Matson scored when McLean hit into a force place at second and Westbrook grounded out.

The second inning was a blank for both teams, as was the top the third for the visitors with Nierman going strong. After Johnson grounded out, Matson poked a single through short; Polando lined to left; McLean doubled to right, scoring Matson and Polando went to third, to score as H. Westbrook hit into a double play.

The visitors got their only tally in the sixth without aid of a hit. Johnson booted a grounder. Nierman threw wild on an attempted sacrifice, and another boot allowed the only tally. This ruined Nierman's chance for a shutout, in his first appearance as a Pelican chucker.

In the eighth the Pelicans added three "insurance" runs. Polando beat out an infield hit. McLean walked. Hank Westbrook singled through left, scoring Polando with McLean going to the "hot" corner. McLean scored on a wild pitch and Richardson came in to relieve Floyd and threw out Edwards at first, and Hank Westbrook tallied on the second baseman's error of Chopper Westbrook's grounder. Nierman flew out to center field and Kimura was thrown out at first.

To Bandon Next Sunday—

The Pelicans will have their metal tested next Sunday when they move to Bandon to meet the potent and ever-dangerous aggregation from that place. It is expected that a Brookings win at this time may go a long way toward deciding the pennant. Bandon lost to Roseburg last Sunday, 8-7, in what was reported to be a real thriller.

Coquille edged North Bend in a 1-0 thriller at Coquille last Sunday, to show the comparative strengths of Brookings and the remainder of the clubs in the league, except Medford, co-holder of first spot with the Pelicans.

Peterson, whom the Pelicans gave rough treatment in the opener, pitched a one-hitter against North Bend, reputed to be about the league's toughest.
