In San Francisco the tourists are always taken past the Palace of Fine Arts building, the only remaining one of the 1915 Panama Pacific International Exposition.

This building is unique in that it has been described as the "most imaginative, romantic interpretation of classic conceptions ever built anywhere."

Who was the architect? Who designed it? Why the same man who laid out the streets of Brookings!

It was Bernard R. Maybeck, recent recipient of the Gold Medal award of the American Institute of Architects, the highest award this august body bestows. Mr. Maybeck shares this honor with Frank Lloyd Wright and other prominent men.

Yes, it was he who first plotted our village! Think of that! Mr. Maybeck now an octogenarian, still maintains an office in San Francisco, resides in the neighboring city of Berkeley. It would be wonderful if he could help us now. We surely need him!

While writing about medal-winners, and June being the month of roses elsewhere, we might mention the three new All-American Rose Winners for 1952. There were none for 1951, none being judged of sufficiently high standard.

The three winners for 1952 are Vogue, Helen Traubel and Fred Howard. Vogue was devel-

oped by an eastern grower, the same grower who developed Fashion. Vogue is a floribunda of perfect hybrid tea form having flowers three to three and a half inches in diameter. The dark oval buds open slowly to a glowing cherry coral flower or spicy fragrance.

Helen Traubel was developed by the Armstrong Nurseries of Ontario, Calif. The color varies with the weather, sometimes a pink, more often shading from apricot to rich orange. It is described as being very hardy, with large leaves, and will grow to be one of the biggest bushes in the rose garden.

Fred Howard, also developed by California growers, Howard & Smith of Montevello, is a hybrid tea of rich yellow pencilled with pink.

Mrs. Roy Sunderland, whose home up the Chetco looks out on peaceful mountain scenes, has an eye for beauty and has written some lovely little verses. I've been saving this for you for a year, until June should come around once more.
