

Bandon Dumped Pelicans, 6 to 2, Last Sunday P. M.

Bandon Millers "winged" the Brookings Pelicans 6 to 2 at Bandon Sunday to drop the Pels from the undefeated class in Southwestern Oregon league to a three-way tie for second spot.

The Millers touched starting pitcher Jim Nierman for two in the first inning, both scoring after two strikeouts. A strong wind carried a high fly by left fielder Ray Stratton over Kimura's head for a double, scoring Hal Teuns who had gotten to first when hit by the pitcher. Stratton tallied for an unearned run as catcher Dick Bishop's ground ball went through Keith Johnson for the only error of the game.

Nierman got by the second inning one-two-three, striking out the last two batters.

The Pelicans tallied their first run in the top of the third. Bob Astin, shortstop, lead off with a single, was doubled off first when "Chopper" Westbrook lined to pitcher Bailey Brem who then fired to first for the twin killing. Nierman, next up, tripled and scored on Ken Kimura's double to center. Keith Johnson struck out to end the threat.

The Millers actually won the game in the bottom of the third with a 4-run barrage, driving Nierman from the mound. Nierman got the first batter as Hal Teuns popped out to Johnson at second. Nierman then issued his first base on balls in two games to put Mickelson on first, who advanced to second on a passed ball. Ray Stratton, leading hitter in the league, then unloaded his second double of the game, and his second RBI, as Mickelson scored. Dick Bishop followed with a single off Astin's glove in deep short with Stratton tallying.

It seemed that Nierman would get by the inning without further damage as Astin raced far back and hauled in Rany Smith's fly ball for the second out. Jack Fassett, next up, singled and set the stage for Harry Therkelson's high infield fly which the wind carried behind Nierman and allowed their fourth run for the frame as Brem drove a single past third to score Fassett.

Bob Astin then came in from shortstop to take over the hurling chores and retired Bob Stolz on a weak tap, pitcher to first. Astin, who reported to the Pels Saturday after being with Medford Rogues in the Far West League since spring training, pitched great ball the remainder of the game, allowing only a single in the sixth and whiffing seven Millers in the sixth, seventh and eighth innings.

Meanwhile Brem, right-hand ace of Oregon State College mound staff, was plenty rough on the Pelicans, allowing but two hits after the third inning, and striking out 13.

The Pelicans second and final run came in the eighth. Bob Astin lead off with his second hit, another single, after two were out, scored when Ken Kimura came through with an-

other extra-base blow, this time a triple. His extra effort in making a triple from a double was wasted as Johnson was whiffed to end the inning.

The Pelicans will travel to Medford next Sunday and are determined to get back into the win column. If they can upset the high-flying Cheney Studs, they will be in a tie again for first place.

Following next Sundays game the Pelicans will be at home on July 1, 8, and 15, meeting Roseburg, North Bend and Reedsport in that order. The box score:
