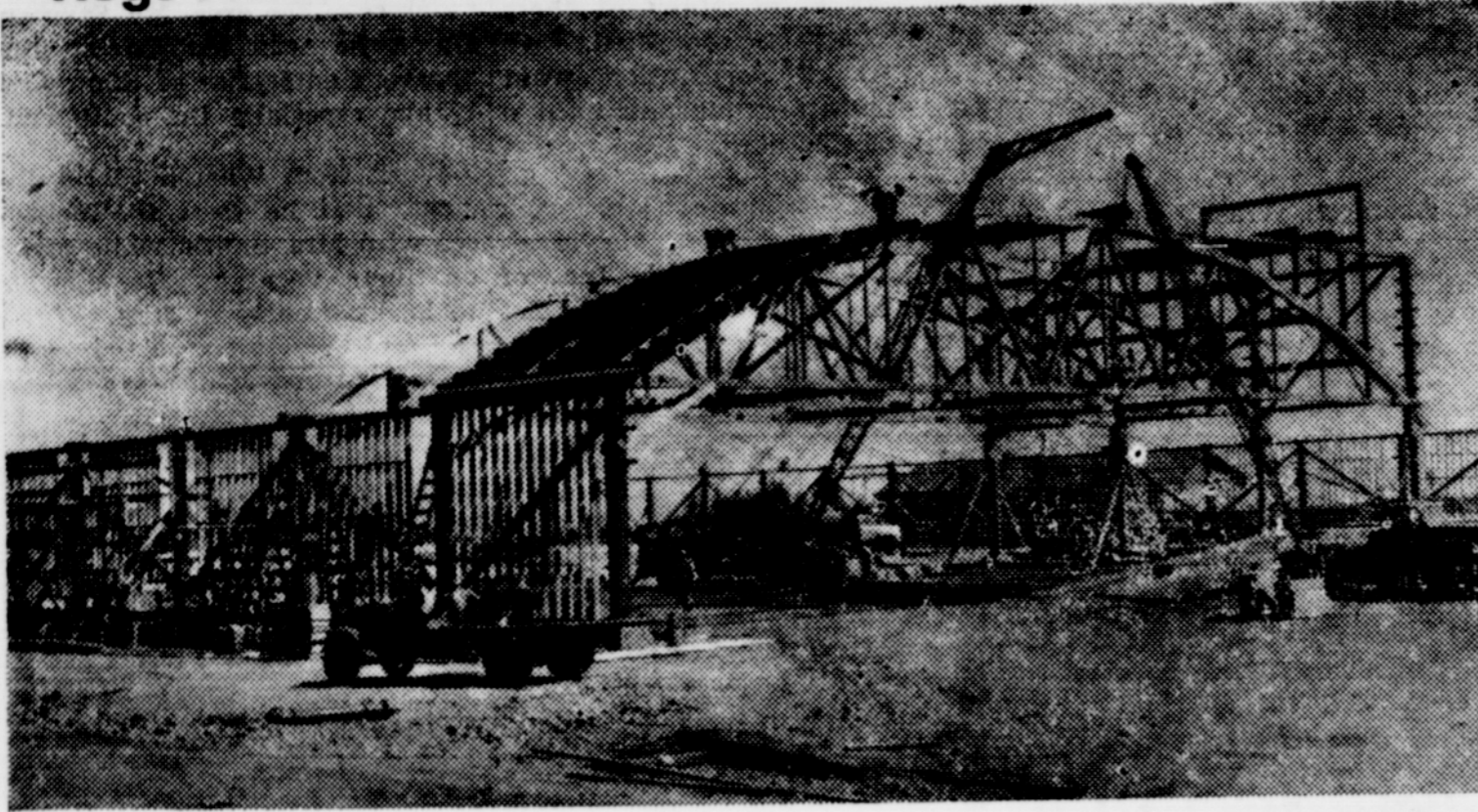
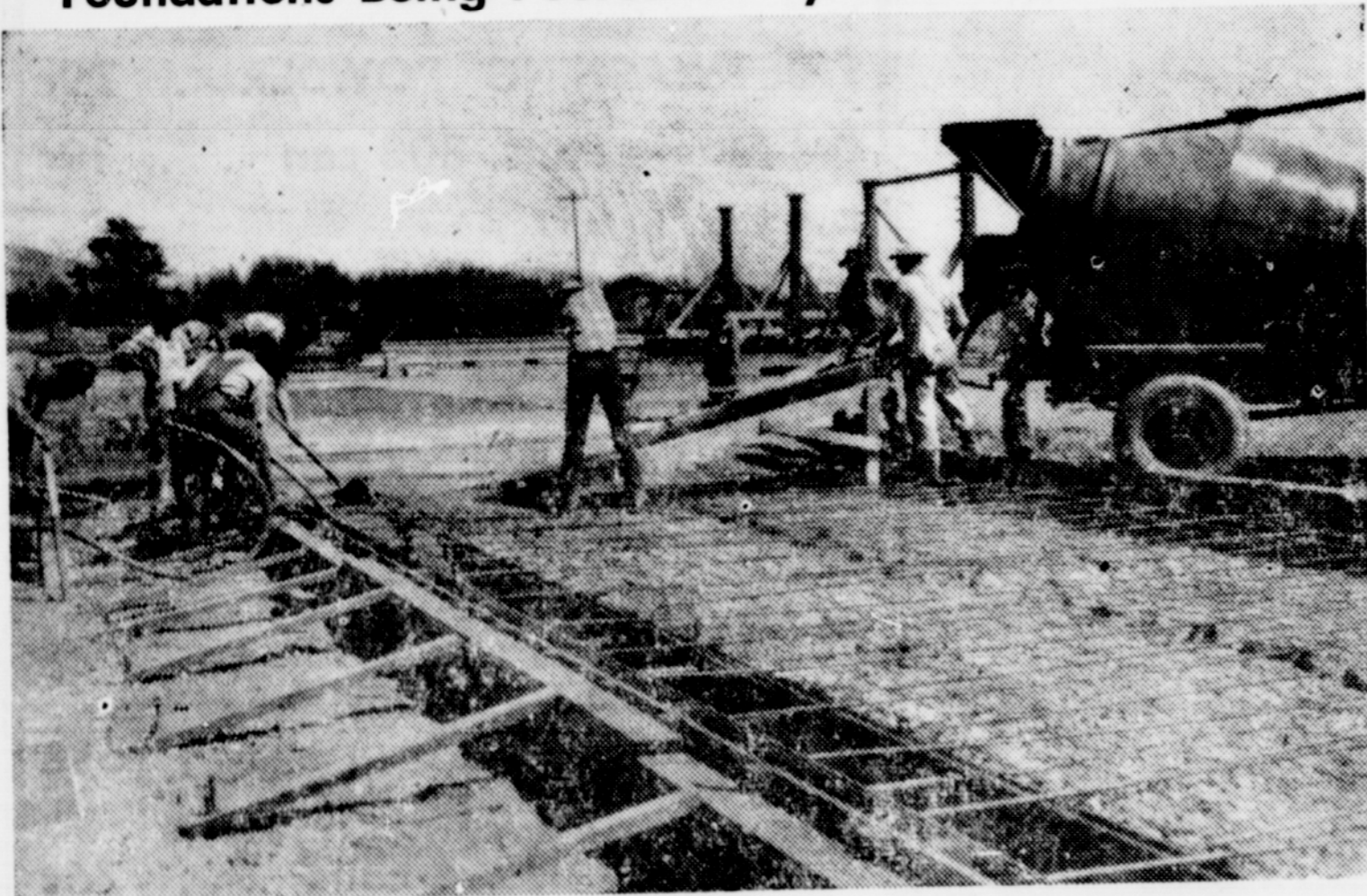


Huge Framework Rises For Brookings 'Plywood' Plant
