

### Medford Dumped Pelicans, 10 to 3, In Sunday's Game

League leading Cheney Studs had a comparatively easy time defeating the Brookings Pelicans at Medford Sunday by a 10 to 3 score, making the most of 13 hits, seven bases on balls and four Brookings errors.

All of the Medford runs came in the first four innings, the final four in the fourth on a combination of two hits, three walks and three errors, driving starting pitcher Astin from the mound. It was plainly not Bob's day to win. The previous week he had looked like a major leaguer at Bandon but the week's work in the mill after securing his release from the Medford Rogues plus the Medford heat apparently robbed him of his "stuff." Bill Selsor, 18-year-old shortstop of Crescent City, took over the mound duties and pitched five-hit ball the remainder of the distance. Only in the seventh did Selsor allow more than one hit per inning. In that frame the Studs whacked him for three blows but a great throw by Ken Kimura after McDonald's fly-out doubled George Gitzen off first base.

Meanwhile the Pelicans found it difficult to shake their batting slump with Paul Gehrman, ex-major leaguer and former Coast league pitcher, throwing four-hit ball.

In the first inning Bill McLean singled with one out, advanced to second on White Matson's infield out, and score an unearned run as Jim Nierman's ground ball went through Connie Holzgang at second for an error.

The Pelicans scored their only other two runs in the third. Kimura, as first batter, drew a walk. Bill McLean then came through with his second straight hit a line-drive to center. As Clarence Mellbye momentarily juggled the ball Kimura hit for third and McLean went to second. Whitey Matson's single scored Kimura and McLean hit the plate when Norm Lucich erred in making his throw to the plate. Gehrman handed the Pelicans a string of goose-eggs the remainder of the way and pitched hitless ball with exception of the ninth when Jim Polando got the fourth and final Brookings hit for the day.

Roseburg, with four wins and one loss for the season to date, comes to Brookings next Sunday. The Chiefs who again have ex-pro Bus Sporer on the mound, and several new additions on the club, are reported to be even stronger than last season when they finished second in Southern Oregon league. The Pelicans, on the other hand, are not daunted but know they have a man-sized job on their hands.
