

PELICANS TAKE 2 FROM COQUILLE; BOTH GAMES WON BY SINGLE RUN

In an exhibit game, Saturday night, Brookings Pelicans edged the Coquille Loggers, 9 to 8, in a free-hitting and quite loosely played game, in which the Pelicans were never behind, although at no time with a secure lead. Selsor hurled the game, and deserved a better fate than was his despite the win.

Sunday, in the game which counted in the league standings, Bill Hanouska pitched and batted in the runs which won his game 2 to 1 against Don White, the OSC ace portsider. While Hanouska was touched for one more blow than was White, he was more effective and kept his hits well spaced.

In the fourth, Keith Johnson single and Hanouska connected with his four-ply smash. That wound up the Pelican scoring, and Coquille was able to push around a run in the seventh.

In the ninth, the Loggers gave the Pelicans anxious moments, when Carlson doubled, White reached first on a fielder's choice with none down. Douglas, however, hit into a double play as Carlson was held to third, and Rose skied out to Astin in center-field. The box scores:
