Dr. Syrney A. Walker, pastor of the Community church, Gold Beach, was principal speaker at the Tuesday luncheon of Rotary Club, using at his topic, "Looking at these times."

"Ever since history records the actions of man, there has always been the forces of evil—no more nor no less than today. There have been Napoleons, Hitlers and others who wanted to conquer and rule the world."

"Communism, as I see it, can never be whipped—it must be cured. People of one part of the world cannot enjoy liberty, and high standards of living, while about half of the remainder live in poverty and squalor. These are the conditions in which Communism gains a foot hold."

"We must bring about some sort of equality among all races, creeds and nations to realize a different kind of a world. We, in this country, are drifting far away from these precepts, too. It therefore behooves us to begin this cure."
