

## 'VFW Post Offers Service In Vicinity

So many eligible veterans and their families have gotten in touch with the Brookings VFW post as a means of better fitting themselves in their new homes here that special arrangements have been made locally, according to Paul Whirry, deputy chief of staff for Oregon.

Whirry states that the local post membership is now near 100. Some newcomers have already transferred from Walla Walla, Eugene, Roseburg, Portland, Phoenix, Ariz., and others have inquired about joining. Veterans may now make their applications to Post 966, and if accepted, will have the balance of 1951 advantages plus all of 1952, at the usual admission of \$2 plus \$5 annual dues to December 31, 1952. Previous members need not pay the admission fee.

Walter Thatcher, post commander, says a large number of the newer veterans and their families have already contacted the post service officer for advice, especially in reference to home loans.

Whirry says applicants for membership in the local post must prove they had recognized overseas service.
