

Old Lighthouse Gets Land Gift

Umpqua Lighthouse State Park slightly dunes, lakes, forested reaches and scenery filled recreation land at the Winchester Bay mouth of the Umpqua has been increased by the gift of 111.81 acres of land owned by the Menasha Wooden Ware Corporation, a Wisconsin corporation.

The park was started in 1930 by a gift of 200a cres of land owned by Douglas county. Between that date and March, 1951, when the Wooden Ware Corporation made its gift of the 111-acre tract bordering and on both sides of the Coast highway just north of the Winchester Bay the park area has been gradually increased to a total of 2,747 acres both by gift and by purchase. The total cost \$4,397, went mainly to the federal government, with several small tracts purchased from private owners. The area secured by purchase totaled 1,392 acres while the remaining 1,355 acres came to the state park department by gift.

The Umpqua Lighthouse was put into service in 1857, on the south side of the entrance to the Umpqua river and—contrary to the biblical injunction—was built on the sand. The present light, based on the rock, has been in operation since 1894, the only major change being in shifting the illuminating power from oil to electricity.
