



Radio free Europe is continually stepping up its barrage against Communist lies, because, in the words of General Lucius D. Clay, national chairman of the Crusade

for Freedom, "if we can win the battle for men's minds, there is a good chance we can prevent the cold war in Europe from becoming a hot war."

The Radio Free Europe transmitter in Munich, Western Germany, built with the \$1,317,000 contributed by Americans during the Crusade for Freedom last fall, is the most powerful station on the continent. It is almost three times more powerful than the largest United States station. Its 135,000 watts compare with the 50,000 watt power of the strongest stations in America. In addition, by using a directional antenna, the Munich station's broadcast is increased to the equivalent

of 700,000 watts. The Munich station concentrates its broadcasts on Czechoslovakia in direct competition with the Kremlin controlled Radio Prague and Radip Bratislava. Munich is on the air 11 1/2 hours every day. The programs expose Communist collaborators and informers, giving names, places and addresses. There also are programs on health, labor, agriculture, drama and even a "soap opera" written by a Czech woman now living in the United States. The program emphasizes the advantages of freedom enjoyed by the western world. Music programs include a disc jockey who wand recordings of concerts played by famous orchestras.

Church Plans Are Advancing Here

Plans for a new Episcopal church in Brookings are advancing rapidly. Subscriptions for the new St. Timothy Church and Youth Center have progressed beyond \$1000 cash and \$5000 in labor and material. Many subscribers have not yet been contacted but it is certain that a building valued at over \$20,000 will be erected soon.

The exterior and interior will be of redwood. It is planned to put a fireplace in the Youth Center as a contribution for all the youth of the community.
