

Public Accountants 'Must' Register

The State Board of Accountancy announces that, as a result of the accounting law enacted by the 1951 legislature, public accountants as well as certified public accountants are now required to register and obtain a license before they can hold themselves out to the public as such.

There have been 287 applications for a license received from public accountants. This represents only a portion of those whom the board feels are required to register. Therefore, for the assistance of the general public and all accountants, the following information summarizes the requirements of the act.

Any one who wishes to use the title, "Public Accountant," or the initials "P.A.," in the state of Oregon, must register with the State Board of Accountancy and obtain a license to practice by October 31, 1951. Licenses will be granted to those who show that:

1. Public accountancy was their principal occupation for the twelve months prior to the effective date of the Act which was August 2, 1951, or

2. They have passed the examination for admission to practice as a certified public accountant and are working for the required experience qualification for a C.P.A. certificate, or

3. They have passed the portion of the examination for certified public accountant designated as accounting practice and intend to make public accounting their principal occupation.

In order to handle the large volume of registrations created by the Act, the State Board has opened an office at 414 American Bank Building, Portland 5, Oregon. The office is open from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., or by appointment. A stenographic secretary,

Miss Margery Moroe, and an executive secretary, Mr. Harold Faunt, have been appointed by the board to assist the board. Applications and information may be obtained in person at the board office, or by phoning Beacon 4040.
