KOREA—Robert L. Kerr, son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry L. Kerr, Brookings, Ore., has been promoted to sergeant for "excellent performance of duty" on the battlefield in Korea.

He is a member of the 15th Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion, which has helped make artillery history by turning its guns from the skies and training them on ground targets. Never before has "ack ack" been used so extensively in firing ground missions as in the Korean conflict.

Kerr has been in the Army 33 months and joined the 15th Battalion, part of the 7th Infantry Division, in August, 1951.

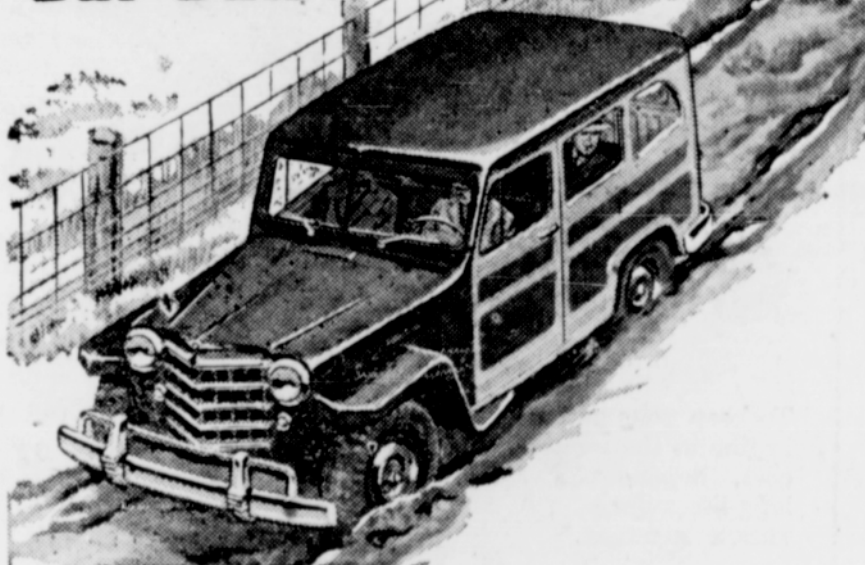
These committees will meet with their chairmen during the annual convention of the association at Gearhart, October 28, 29 and 30, and report to the membership.

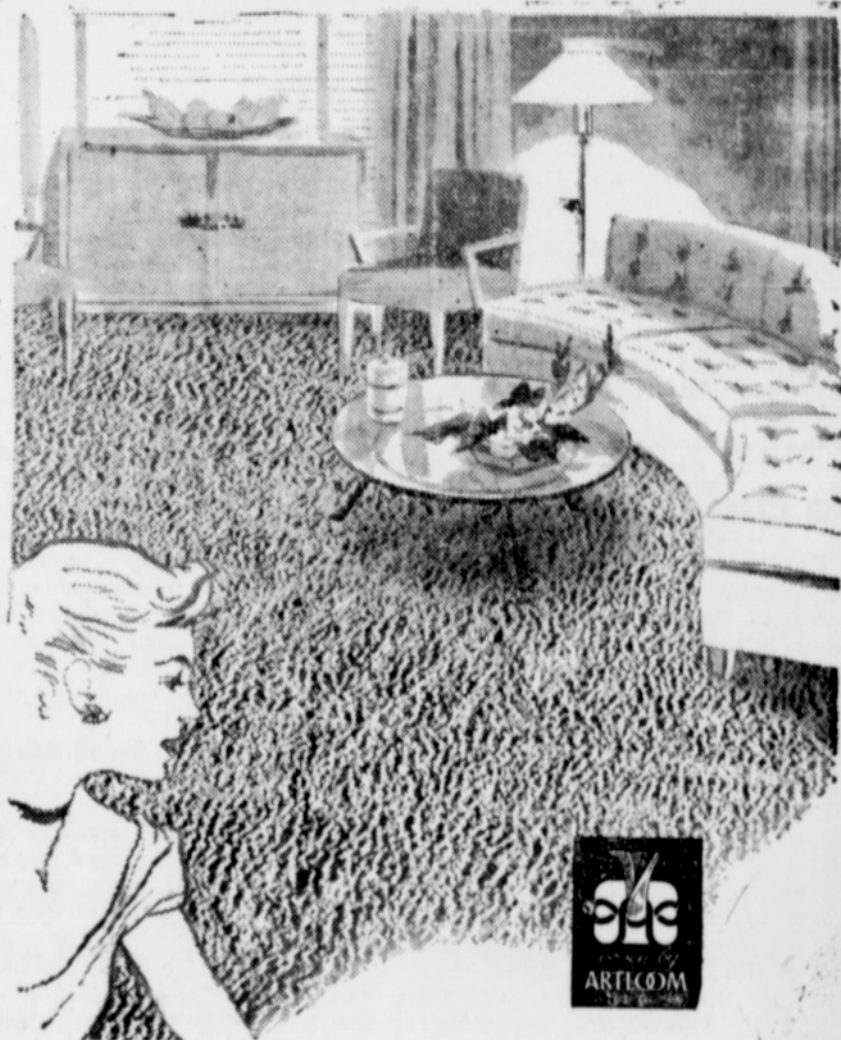
