Several kinds of conifer and broadleaf trees are available. Conifers available include: Douglas fir, Port Orford cedar, Nobel, Silver and Shasta fir, lodge pole pine, Norway spruce and Chinese arborvitae. Broadleaf trees are: Black locust, Russian mulberry, Russian olive, Caragena, Chinese elm and cascara.

Cost of the trees range from \$7.50 to \$10 per thousand. This includes cost of shipping from the forest nursery to the farmers. Farmers wanting to obtain these trees will want to get their copy of the bulletin, "Forest Trees for Farm Planting."

Ten Reasons Why:
