

Squar Log Raising Boosted As "New"

"The Squar' Log," said to be the dream of many botanists, horticulturists, or what have you, is being lauded as a new Humboldt County business, according to Lyndon Ripley, a free lance writer who had an article in a recent Sunday Oregonian, telling how much it annually would save the world in sawing of lumber.

The article goes on to say: "For years foresters and lumbermen have dreamed about the ideal tree—a square one.

"Think of the increased yield of lumber from a square log as opposed to the old-fashioned big round ones. Immeasurable labor and waste would be eliminated in the sawmills.

"Just recently, during the dedication of the Hammon Lumber Company's Van Dusen tree farm, in Humboldt County, Calif., it was announced that finally square trees were being grown from nothing more than square seeds.

"As proof, the tree pictured in a photograph (available to the unwary) with Harry "Blackie" Freeman foreman of the Cummings Creek camp, standing on the truck, were exhibited.

"Finally, with kidding put aside—it was explained that this particular redwood tree had been located by company timber fallers in the course of ordinary operations on the Van Dusen farm. It had stood in a cluster of trees and had been study enough to kill off the others, but in so doing it had been forced to grow in an angular manner, resulting in an almost square shape."

Chetco Pete and Winchuck Joe, two of the remaining old-time Paul Bunyan type loggers of these parts are experimenting. They have decided to plant trees in a group of square pots, which pots have sides tall enough to shape the tree for the first dozen or more years, then hoping as "the twig is inclined, so the tree is bent." Smith River Charley and Pistol River Red are watching

the work with keen eye, hoping to live long enough to see some results.

The Plywood boys are about to serve a restraining order on these botanists, claiming that square and flat plywood must come from perfectly round trees. "You can't improve upon nature," Ed Sund told his lawyer.

Later Publication Date Is Urged
