**Call Regularly For Best Results**

The presence of unprofitable birds in a laying flock, regardless of how many or how few, is a definite handicap to flock efficiency and economy. That's why it is extremely important to observe birds closely and remove any that may show inactivity and an inability to produce well.

Right now, the layers are in good production on most farms. Just the same, raisers should be on guard against early molting layers. Any bird that goes into an early molt is not profitable, and should not be kept in the laying flock. Since such birds will not return to production for a few months and are incapable of completing a fully laying season, it is best that they be marketed.

**SIGNS OF MOLT**

Early molters can be detected in most instances. They usually show small dried-up combs, a general lack of activity, and a condition of loose and falling feathers. On the other hand, birds which retain their red combs, have worn, tattered, soiled and broken feathers, and perhaps are slightly "bald" behind the comb—yet continue to lay well—are desirable late molting types and should be kept in the flock. Remember, the condition of the plumage is not to be considered as molting.

A molt or change of feathers occurs in chickens every year. First, the head feathers drop out, followed by the feathers of the neck, breast, body, wings, and tail. Some birds, however, may shed a few tail feathers before the wing feathers. The new ones begin coming in as soon as the old feathers are dropped.

The above describes a normal molt. There is also a partial molt, which may take place at any time during the year. Such molts are usually caused by mismanagement, change of feed, a disease epidemic, or anything that throws the flock out of production. The partial molt is often referred to as a "neck molt." It occurs frequently in the fall among early-hatched pullets that go into a slump when the first cold weather hits.

Be alert for signs of early molting. Inspect any birds you suspect. Then verify their conditions. And remember, an early molter is generally a poor layer. For further and more particular details consult Brookings Feed and Seed.
