

Ideal Home Now On Langlois Site

The Oregonian hostess house model home has been under reconstruction at Langlois—and is now completed and an open house will be held every day from Nov. 18 through Nov. 25.

This is the home that was built as a result of the housing survey held by the Oregonian. It was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Caughell of Langlois, after being featured at the 8-day home show at Portland last May. It was torn down, moved to Langlois, where it has been reconstructed on the 64-acre farm belonging to Mr. and Mrs. Caughell. Due to popular request the open house dates have been set.

Philippine mahogany siding and masonry trim, together with knotty pine textured cedar paneling make up the beautiful exterior. Details provided in the various rooms worth remembering are numerous. An effort to use natural motifs in the decoration, wherever suitable, was made by the interior planning consultants.

The kitchen of the model home

was designed in a U shape, and the work area is midway between the utility room and a kitchen-eating area. Arranged from the door opening into the kitchen from the utility room are the refrigerator, work surface, automatic sink with garbage disposal unit and dishwasher. Work surface and range on the inside divider, between kitchen proper and dinette. White metal cabinets are over and under the counters and assure clean usable storage.

The bath room, located conveniently at the center of the 3-bedroom wing, provides a Persian red recessed tub, built-in lavatory and dressing table and alcove for water closet. Ample light and privacy are furnished by glass blocks over the dressing table.

Anyone visiting the home will find suggestions of interest to incorporate in their own home. Admission will be 50c for anyone over 14 years.
