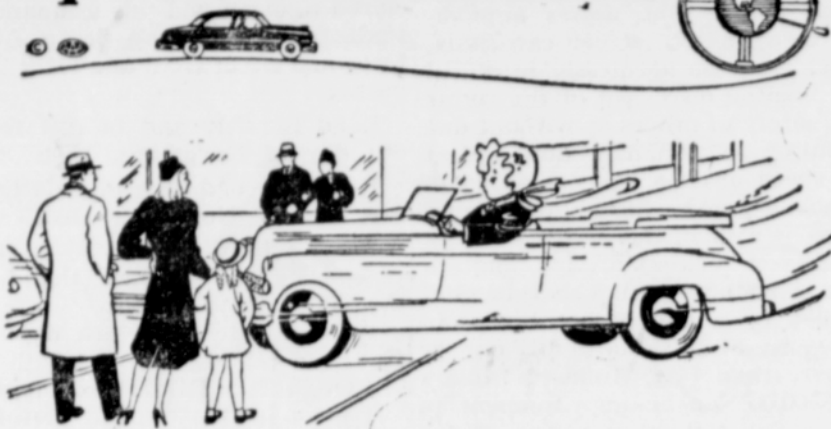

Chick Chats

Ventilate Your Laying House . . .

Ventilation is one of the most important concerns of the poultry-raiser. Without plenty of fresh air, birds confined to the laying house have little chance of making a top production record. Fresh clean air—minus drafts—is essential. It not only promotes better health in the flock, but it also prevents dampness and carries off foul, unpleasant odors.

Adjustable windows can provide most laying houses with suitable ventilation. This is especially true where the house is less than 24 feet deep. In such houses adequate winter ventilation can be maintained by adjustment of the front windows, which should be made to tilt back into the house from the top. Windows should be located high in the front wall and when tilted should provide at least a 10-inch opening. The sash should be made so that it can be removed easily during mild weather.

MUSLIN OR BURLAP

Here's another suggestion. Cover one-third to one-half of the window space in the south side of the laying house with muslin or burlap. This method permits a slow exchange of air without causing any direct drafts on the birds.

During the changeable wet weather of fall—and spring, too—the rear window and end doors should be kept closed. Check these very carefully and ventilate chiefly through the front windows. You can keep the front windows open until water begins to freeze inside the house. Then regulate the windows, closing some of them so that sufficient heat is retained as the weather gets colder. Be careful not to close all windows completely, even if it is difficult to keep house temperature above freezing. Layers can become better adjusted to sudden weather changes if they have been accustomed to a cool house.

DAMP LITTER

Damp litter is the cause of many irregularities in the laying house. By supplying your birds with proper ventilation, you can do much to prevent dampness. Of course, there are other causes of damp litter. An over crowded house and faulty litter management are two. But poor ventilation is frequently the cause of the trouble. Do all you can to keep your birds healthy this winter. Start by providing them with fresh clean air through proper ventilation.
