All told of their visit at the convention of the League of Oregon City, at Portland, how the

"The league of Oregon Cities convention is a place where all cities come with their problems—where, too, there are some who have an answer, who have stepped up against the same kind of a problem of similar. It seems that there is no city problem which the league is not able to answer."

"Each of us tried to cover as many of the panel discussions as possible, but there were too few of us to take in all," asserted Mr.

Dimmick. "Yet, we were fortunate in being able to take in the discussions which we believe are most beneficial."

Each councilman told of the different discussion groups he had attended, of how he came away with a feeling that Brookings is fortunate in that it has the combined experience of every city in coming up with the right answers to all local problems.

Also present at the same meeting were Bill Brown, chief of police; Hans Nelson, the municipal judge, and Samuel Hall, city attorney.

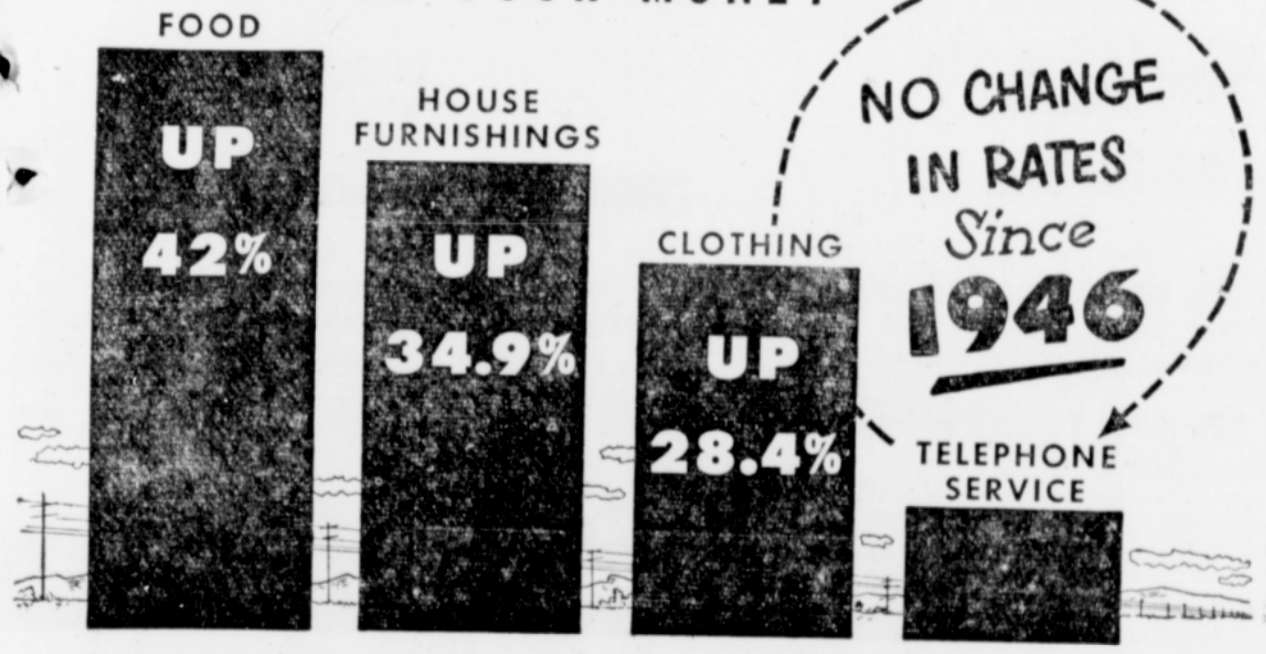
