

Denmark Youths Oregon Winners In Amateur Contest

GOLD BEACH—Word has just been received by the county extension office that Wilbur and Judy Jenson of Denmark, have been selected as Oregon winners in the amateur talent contest, sponsored by the United States Rubber Co.

Their award for winning this state contest is an educational trip to the national 4-H Congress in Chicago, with all expenses to be paid by the U. S. Rubber Co. according to Clifford Jenkins, the county agent. They will leave Portland at 5:30 p. m. Nov. 22 with the other Oregon delegates and will return on Dec. 5.

While at Chicago they will participate in all the national 4-H Club Congress events and be featured on some of the radio broadcasts in connection with the congress. They will also take part in the 4-H club activities in connection with the national livestock show also being held at Chicago at the same time.

Wilbur and Judy are son and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. R. Jensen and Mr. Jensen plans to accompany the delegation and may accompany Judy and Wilbur in their performances.

A record was made of Wilbur and Judy playing Dixieland style music on Trumpet and Clarinet, and this was the recording sent to Chicago with their pictures, from which the judges made their selections.

They play solo and duets and do song and dance routines. Original tryouts were made at Corvallis during the 4-H summer school in June with some 22 other boys and girls participating. Both Wilbur and Judy are starting their third year of 4-H club work, said Clifford Jenkins, the county agent.
