SHOW FOR SUPPORT OF BAND

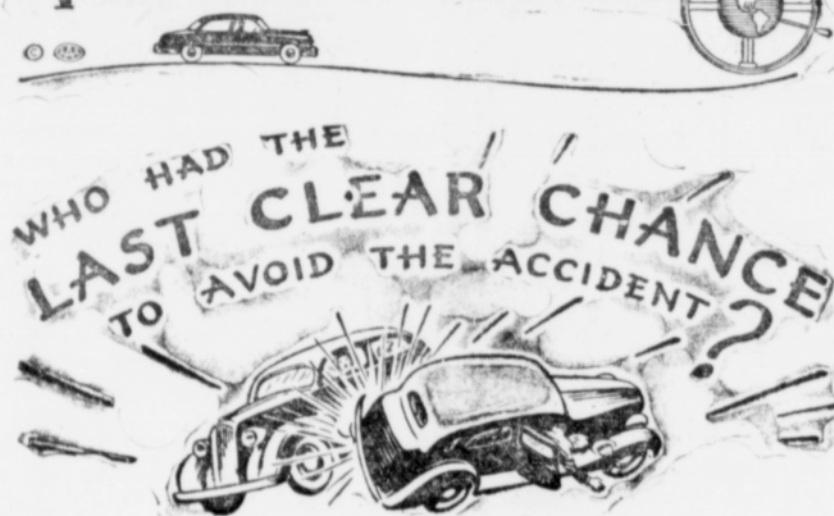

PUT SAFETY FIRST

So you had the right-of-way? And you landed in the hospital! Right there you learned one of the facts of life—the right-of-way is not always the right way.

Right-of-way does not always give you the right to drive on immediately. It gives you that privilege only if you can proceed with safety, says the AAA driver training book, "Sportsmanlike Driving."

Even a driver with the right-of-way is obligated by law to help protect everybody on the street.

Don't let a traffic court sur-

prise you with the important principle of the last clear chance. Here is the way it works.

Suppose Tom, Dick, or Harry violates a traffic regulation and crashes into your car when you had the right-of-way. If you failed to use the last clear chance to do all you could to prevent that accident, the court could put the blame on YOU.

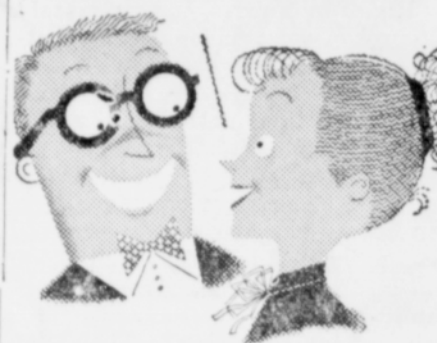
Right-of-way is nice to have under ordinary circumstances. But it can prove a flimsy support in case of accident.
