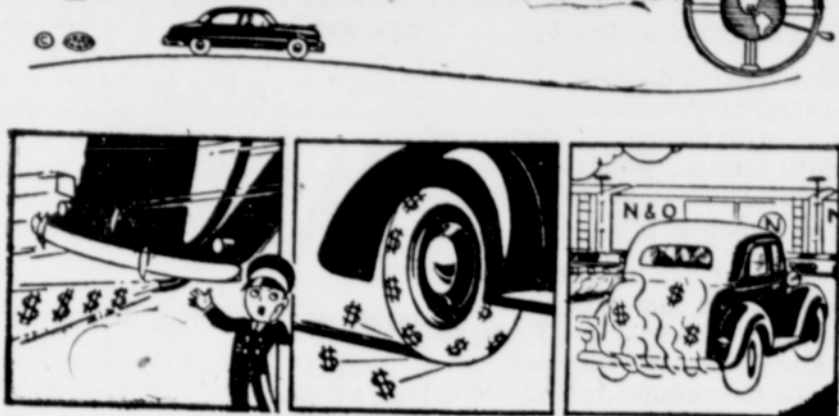
## Party Honored Twins' Birthday

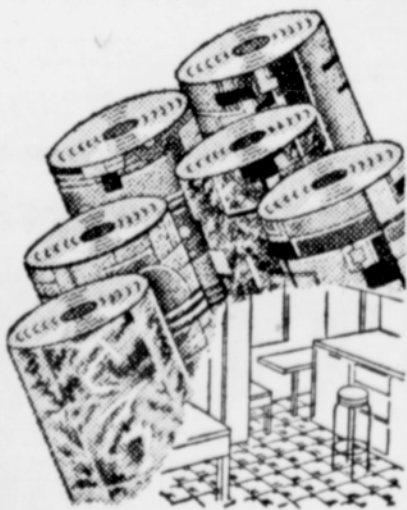
Mrs. Bomar came here from Milwaukie, Ore., in September to assume management of the Nook Cafe. Mr. Page is a brother of Mike Page of this city.

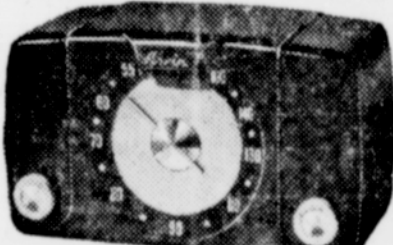

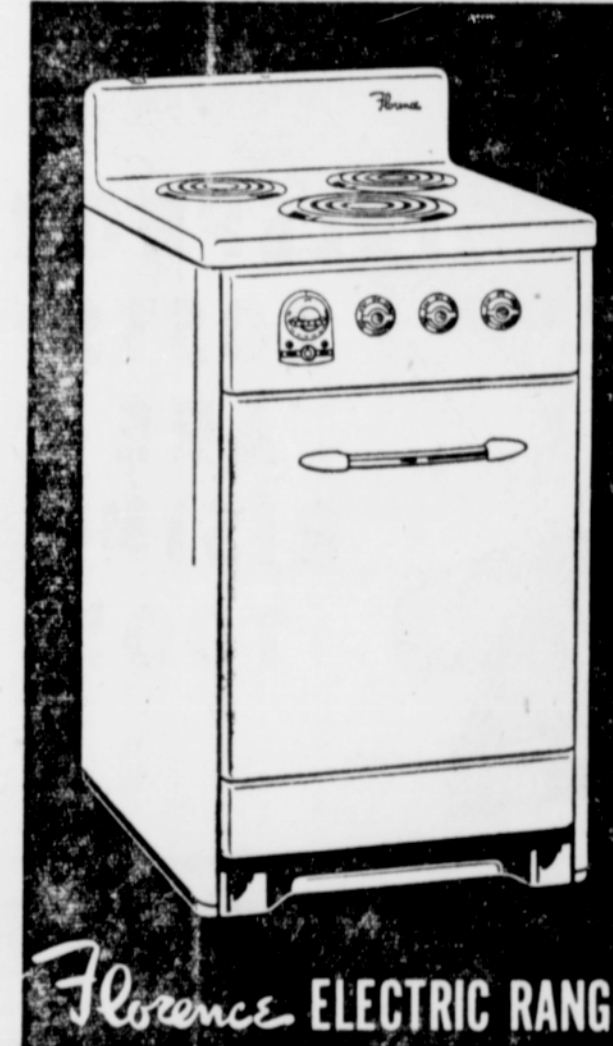
