WEAR WHITE AT NIGHT

Darkness may be good for owls and bats. It's hard on pedestrians. Most pedestrian traffic deaths occur between 5 p.m. and 1 a.m., says the AAA driver training book, "Sportsmanlike Driving."

The man on foot at night, especially if he cannot drive, thinks a motorist sees him much farther than is possible. Car headlights look so bright, you feel sure you are seen.

That depends! What are you wearing? If you wear dark clothing, the driver sees you by

means of only a very little reflected light.

Under the best conditions, pedestrians are almost invisible to the driver until the car is nearly on them. Rain, snow, fog, dirty windshields, or inefficient headlights make matters worse. They cut way down on a driver's visibility. It becomes mighty hard for him to see pedestrians.

Protect yourself. Wear white clothes or carry something white when you walk at night. Make sure you will be seen. *White at night gives more light!*

At the start of November the weather bureau informed listeners that the rainfall was below normal for the year. That, evidently, has been taken up, with 15.41 inches reported for the month, and a fair start already made in December.
