

Pacific Bulb Growers Maintain Prices For 'Bulbs' At Local Meet, Tues. Eve.

A good crowd and harmony was shown at the annual meeting of the Pacific Bulb Growers Association, at the Chetco Grange hall, Tuesday evening, despite the real stormy weather outside. Several came here from as far away as Portland.

One of the interesting matters for discussion was the cause of the confusion over the prices of bulbs this year. There is one grower who represents a wealthy "big-farm" firm. Immediately after the spring meeting of Pacific Bulb Growers Association he took it upon himself to immediately wire one of the jobbers that he wanted 12½ cents for his seven-inch bulbs. The code price was 15 cents.

Therefore all this confusion has resulted. However, it was found by comparing reports that many buyers have been loyal and paid the code price, 15c, 25c, 30c and 35c. These deserve the praise given them at the meeting. But because of the action of the aforementioned free-lance grower, a few growers have been forced to take 12½ cents for their seven-inch bulbs. It looks to the association that the fairness rule should work both ways—since some of the growers got the full code price that all growers, in fairness, should receive full price. But a few of the jobbers are still hanging on to the money due their

growers so as to be sure to have it in case they can possibly find some excuse to scare some weak grower into accepting a cut.

One large jobber has been made the butt of the trouble by the other buyers. "When he pays up, we will," they write the growers. Some of the growers for this good jobber relieved the situation by reporting, when asked, that this offending fellow has agreed to pay up at 12½c, 25c, 30c and 35c. What a relief! All have the American right to decide what has been the real cause of all this trouble. One group of jobbers say it was caused by the growers deciding what their cost was too early in the season, but one fellow sums up the concensus on the cause in two words, "Pure Cussedness."

The only cure seemed to be to appeal to the state for protection against such in the future. Suggestions of plans for selling direct to the greenhouses received favorable response.
