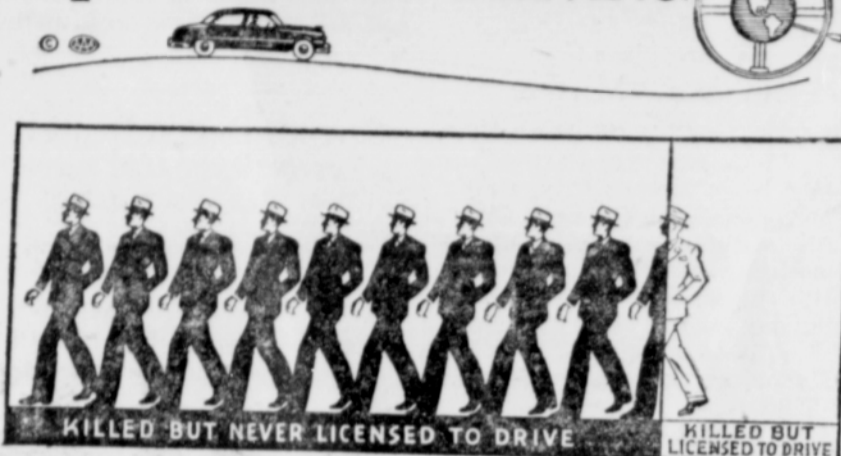

WALK RIGHT AND LIVE

The non-driver has a bad pedestrian record!

Nine out of ten adult pedestrians killed in motor accidents do not drive automobiles. They don't know what cars and drivers cannot do. So they step right out into danger.

Non-drivers do not know how far an automobile goes before it can possibly be stopped—even at moderate speeds, says the AAA driver training book, "Sportsmanlike Driving." They do not realize that it takes time to change the direction of a car. They do not know how

many different things tease the driver's attention.

Connecticut made a study of 1,031 traffic deaths of pedestrians over 15 years of age and found that 95% had never been licensed to drive.

If you do not drive a car, be extra-careful how you walk. Look in both directions before you step off the curb. Do not jaywalk. Obey all traffic regulations. Safe walking requires sportsmanship of both driver and pedestrian. *Walk right and live!*
