**9 Violated Labor Laws In Curry Co.**

SALEM—A December check of Curry county employers for compliance with the state wage and hour law revealed violations in that coastal area, Labor Commissioner Wm. E. Kimsey said.

The survey showed that nine Curry employers were working minors under the age of 18 without first securing permits issued by the state labor department as required by law.

Work schedules in excess of the

legal 8-hour day, 44-hour week were found in six establishments, Kimsey said. One employer was skipping rest periods set for the women employees.

Brookings had the highest incidence of violations, 8. Gold Beach was second with 4. Langlois had 3 and Wedderburn 2. None were reported at Port Orford. Oregon wage and hour law covers women and minors under 18. It sets a minimum wage and maximum working hours and, also, establishes specific regulations within various trades and industries. Passed in 1913, it is administered by the state bureau of labor.

**18-Year-Olds Must Register For Draft**

Just a reminder to all boys who will soon be eighteen or are already eighteen and have failed to register for selective service: You must register for selective service within five days after you are eighteen. If you have a birth certificate, bring it with you when registering.

So many boys have been registering who are not yet eighteen that now a birth certificate, if available, is necessary. One may telephone the school or parents to verify birth date.

The local board is located in Room 208 Hall Building, Coos Bay, and office hours are 8:30 to 5:00 Monday through Friday. The office is closed Saturday. Boys may register locally with Mrs. Eva Lea Long, at Lesmeister's office.
