1951 Rainfall Is Above 'Normal'

With an average rainfall for this area of about 75 inches per year 1951, Tuesday, was reported by Paul Whirry local weather observer as being 81.65 inches, or about six inches above normal.

Last year, 1950, with 105 inches of moisture, was about the heaviest to be recorded since the installation of the local station.

The present cold wave, which makes local people shiver and hunt for the stoves, is nothing in comparison of what is being experienced by other sections of the nation where record low temperatures and snowfall have all but stopped business and traffic.

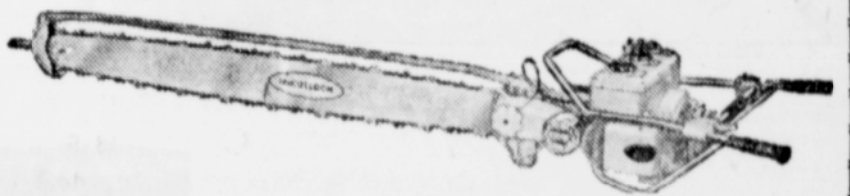
