On Surrender of County Roads To the City of Brookings.

Notice is hereby given that a Hearing will be held in the Curry County Court Room in Curry County Court House in Gold Beach, Oregon, on Wednesday, the 9th day of January 1952, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of determining whether it is necessary or expedient or for the business interest of Curry County to surrender to the City of Brookings jurisdiction there of all county roads or portions thereof, located and being within the corporate limits of the City of Brookings, Oregon, save excepting the road known as Azalea Park Road, and to consider any testimony offered by any person interested in this Hearing.
