GOOD NEWS for HOMEMAKERS by Anne Marshall



Come Christmas and the family eagerly awaits a splendid array of goodies from your kitchen. Let them feast on spicy Date Cake, a real dreamy dessert for the holidays.

There's a cookery secret that gives this cake its rosy color and rich flavor. Here's the secret—the liquid in the cake is condensed tomato soup. This ingredient gives a desirable moistness as well as enriching the flavor. Dates, nuts, and spices do the rest.

Date Cake

- 1/4 cup butter or hydrogenated shortening
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon soda
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 can (1 1/4 cups) condensed tomato soup
- 1 1/2 cups dates, chopped

Cream shortening; add sugar gradually and cream well. Stir in beaten egg. Sift together the flour (reserving 2 tablespoons to mix with dates), baking powder, soda, and cinnamon. Add the sifted dry ingredients alternately with the tomato soup to the butter-sugar mixture. Stir in the dates. Pour into a greased 9-inch square pan or into muffin pans. Bake in a moderate oven (350°F.) for about 40 minutes (for square pan) or 25 minutes (for cupcakes). Serve with a hot vanilla sauce, spiced with cinnamon. Or top with thin vanilla pudding. Makes 9 large pieces or 18 small cupcakes.

LIGHT SNACK: After heavy holiday eating, appetites turn to simple food. Then it's time to serve a buffet supper featuring hot cream of asparagus soup, and chicken or turkey sandwiches with raw crisp vegetable relishes. Have the soup in a tureen with a holiday garnish on top—like parsley or popcorn.

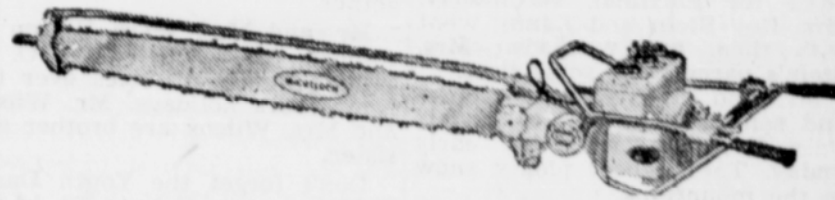

BEHIND EACH NEW TELEPHONE

There's a lot more to adding new telephones to our system than just new telephone instruments. Miles of wire and cable are required; complex central office equipment must be added; often the entire telephone plant must be enlarged.

Our telephone system has been strained to the very limits of its capacity. In order to provide the needed phones for the growing areas we serve and to continue to improve telephone service for all of our present customers, we are now planning a new expansion program totalling about thirteen million dollars.

In order to insure fair earnings for the people who will invest their money to finance this program of new construction, we find it necessary to request increases in telephone rates. However, due to the increased efficiency our new equipment makes possible, the increases we are requesting are far below the increases in most other prices since the time of our last rate adjustment in 1946.
