

Wild Life Show Is Billed For Tonite

Under sponsorship of Chetco Rod & Gun Club, this area will be brought an outstanding wild-life picture, in kodachrome, at the Grange hall this Thursday (today) evening, at 7:30, according to Carl Berger.

Grover A. Young' for many years a big game guide and outfitter in the heart of British Columbia's Canadian Rockies, personally narrates his new adventures in the "Land of the Golden Twilight."

This outstanding wildlife movie in kodachrome, was taken by Mr. Young in the area just west of Jasper Park in the Bowron Lawe district. Until a year ago, when Mr. Young sold his lodge, his movie camera was always a part of his equipment when taking parties on trips around a scenic chain of lakes. His film, which is not the conventional travelogue, shows many close-up scenes of mountain goats, moose, bulls, cows with twin calves, black and brown bears and the mighty grizzly.

This last summer, Mr. Young and his wife returned to the area mentioned and spent the entire

summer taking wildlife pictures. Many days were spent in obtaining one of the finest films ever shown of Beavers in their natural habitat. People watching this film will be amazed at the close-up scenes of Beavers cutting willows, and dragging them into the river, their engineering ability in the construction of the dams across streams, and at the thing they are noted for—swimming. You will marvel at the size of trees they have cut down—some exceeding four feet in diameter.

Mr. and Mrs. Young followed a salmon run to the spawning beds at the headquarters of a northern river. They used a light boat as far as it was possible to navigate it, then they had to back-pack on up the river, following game trails as there are no man-made trails in this area. They saw and photographed the thousands of salmon fighting their way up stream, so thick at times that the river was red with them.

In this picture one will see the salmon pairing off and digging their nests in coarse gravel. One can see them spawning and covering the eggs by stirring up the gravel. See the fights as each pair protects the spot they have chosen to spend the few remaining days of their life cycle. You will see the last survivor of the run as he tries to keep upright in the river but finally turns over on his back and drifts down the stream. These salmon have not died in vain for the eggs hatched on these spawning beds will provide the fish that four years later will be seen coming out of the ocean and fighting their way up this same river to spawn and to die: thus completing the four-year life cycle nature has allotted the sockeye salmon.

One will, of course, see fighting scenes. There are dozens of trout crowding each other to get at a fly cast in the green, clear water of a river. There are Kamloops trout and many other fish. The ladies will revel in the beautiful sunsets, waterfalls, the wild flowers of the high country, the un-

spoiled lakes and stream photographed against the back ground of the majestic grandeur of the Canadian Rockies. This film will run for one and three-fourths hours.
