Pilot Soon Will Be 'Six Years Old'

Southern Curry has seen many changes in the past six years, since March 7, 1946, when Volume 1, Number 1, of the Pilot appeared. To recount these many changes would require an issue much larger than an average issue of the Oregonian, so will not be attempted. However, it may be said that the faith prompting the Pilot to enter this field has been more than justified.

If progress in the next five or six years will match the expansion of the past six, there will be a city in this area comparable to many of the other rapid-growing areas of the coast. The Pilot will not be rash enough to make

even a wild guess of the future. So much depends upon how well the people of the area co-operate in this expansion program, how well the city planning and zoning committee achieves the results they hope for, and how well the general economic conditions of the world remain stable.

The Pilot is about to close its sixth year—six years of Oregon's greatest expansion, if the Pilot may be permitted to state that.
