

### Welfare Budget Is Set For Curry Co.

GOLD BEACH — An annual budget totalling \$114,422 for the fiscal year, 1952-53 was officially approved at the regular meeting of Curry County Welfare Commission held last Wednesday. H. D. Olney, administrator for the commission, explained Thursday that the agency's budget will now be submitted to the state public welfare commission for final approval.

half or \$59,850 is earmarked for old age assistance. Another \$2,048 is earmarked for medical care of old age assistance recipients.

The aid to dependent children program would receive the next largest slice under the proposed budget, Olney stated. A total of \$23,400 is earmarked for this program with an additional \$1,056 for medical care of aid to dependent children families.

The budget of \$6,432 for aid to disabled and another \$1200 for medical care of aid to disabled cases. A total of \$4,185 would be provided for general assistance with another \$2,592 provided for medical care of general assistance cases. Foster home care of children would total \$3,630 under the proposed budget.

Of this total budget, \$19,647 would be contributed by Curry county, \$52,360 by the state of Oregon and \$42,415 by the United States government, Olney said.

The commission also voted, at this meeting, to set up a standard allowance of \$2.80 per day for restaurant meals in cases where it is necessary to authorize restaurant meals for public assistance recipients. Olney explained Thursday that such meals are never authorized when any other plan of meeting the individual's needs are feasible. This allowance of \$2.80 per day is broken to allow 65c for breakfast, 90c for lunch and \$1.25 for dinner.

The commission also voted to protest a proposed method of taking percentage reductions in public assistance grants which would allow a family having income of some other than public assistance an advantage over the family which had no such income. Percentage reductions in public assistance grants are made when over it appears that funds budgeted are going to be inadequate. The Proposal for the changed method of taking the percentage reductions was made by the state public welfare administrator's policy committee, which is composed of nine county administrators in Oregon.

council. The culprits are safely guarded at present, elsewhere. The cash register was restored to its owners—and the only difference from the normal picture was the broken door at the service station and freedom of a pair who had taking ways.

For reasons names were not given to the Pilot, but it is said

one of the pair had once been employed at the Mobil station.
