

## Winchuck Timber Sold For \$29.00

GOLD BEACH—What was believed to be a record for timber prices, sold by the Forest Service at an oral auction at Grants Pass on March 25, was bid by Southern Oregon Plywoods, of Grants Pass, according to a statement made by John Porisch, district ranger, this week. The timber, in the Winchuck valley, near the Oregon-California line, sold for \$29.00 per thousand for Douglas fir.

This eight acres of timber, located in Section 18, Township 41 South, Range 12 west, has an estimated volume of 750,000 board feet, and on that assumption will bring in \$22,000, or a per acre average of \$2750.

On the same basis the return to counties within the Siskiyou National Forest in lieu of taxes will be \$5500, or almost \$700 per acre.

## Timber Sales Gain In Pacific N. W.

PORTLAND — Pacific Northwest national forest receipts for the first eight months of the fiscal year 1952 climbed \$21¼ million, an increase of \$4¼ million over the same period the previous year, according to Regional Forester J. Herbert Stone. The fiscal year began July 1.

Topping the 19 national forests in the region is the Willamette, Eugene, Ore., which collected \$3,911,923—an increase of \$1,841,710 over the same period of last year.

Second and third highest in-

come-producing forests in the Oregon-Washington region were the Olympic and Clifford Pinchot, which collected \$2,320,300 and \$1,641,839 respectively. Headquarters for the Olympic forest is in Olympia, Wash., and the Gifford Pinchot is in Vancouver, Wash.

Twenty-five per cent of national receipts is returned to the counties in which the forests lie and used for schools and roads. An additional 10 per cent of the total receipts is used for forest service roads and trails.

Payments to counties have increased steadily in recent years according to Stone. In the fiscal year 1951, Oregon counties received more than \$4¼ million or an average of 29c from each acre of national forest land. Washington received \$2¼ million; 22c per acre on the average.

Receipts from other Pacific Northwest national forests for the first eight months of fiscal year 1952 are: Cheland (Okanogan, Wash.), \$480,912; Deschutes (Bend Oregon), \$660,912; Fremont (at Lakeview), \$1,218,694; Malheur (John Day), \$1,109,426; Mt. Baker, Bellingham, Wash.) \$1,400,542; Mt. Hood (Portland) \$1,354,833; Ochoco (Prineville), \$1,529,888; Rogue River (at Medford), \$879,073; Siskiyou (Grants Pass) \$514,888.

Also, Siuslaw (Corvallis) \$756,097; Snoqualmie (Seattle), \$1,156,010; Umatilla (Pendleton), \$32,887; Umpqua (Roseburg), \$1,546,831; Wallowa (Enterprise), \$88,115; Wenatchee (Wenatchee), \$309,913; Whitman, Baker, Ore.) \$335,673.

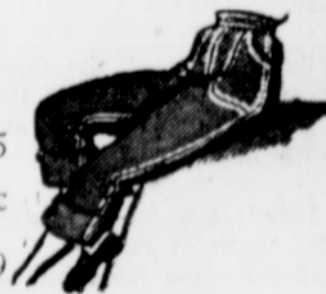
