### Voter's Pamphlets Now Being Printed

SALEM—State printing presses are turning out the new Oregon Voter's pamphlet for distribution before the May 16 primary elections, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry, wrote the Pilot.

Newbry reports that 826,000 pamphlets will be issued, as indicated in a statement to Supervisor of Elections David O'Hara in which he says that 41 different editions of the booklet will be printed. While O'Hara's election office force continues making revision and corrections for later issues, the state printing department is now printing and assembling the initial pamphlets which,

by law, will be sent to the most remote areas of Oregon first. The first run will go to Baker, Crook, Deschutes, Klamath and Lake Counties comprising the second congressional district. These will contain only material on candidates for state offices.

Following pamphlets, both Republican and Democratic parties, will have added to them the county office candidates, according to O'Hara. These will go to the more populated counties where there are more county candidates running for office. Largest of the pamphlets will be the third congressional district, which takes in Multnomah county only. Though there will be only one Republican party candidates booklet for the third district, as compared to seven pamphlets for the second district, it will contain 132 pages. The Democratic pamphlet for the same district will have 72 pages.
