

Two Panels Will Make A 'Closet'

Closet space, or the lack of it has caused many a home to be just what the owner does not particularly like, especially the little homemaker who tries to be the queen of that realm.

Of course, there can be no fast rule in this assertion but two panels of plywood, some quarter-round, two hinges and a latch of some sort will build a closet in almost any room.

Take two 3/4-inch panels of plywood, cut to fit ceiling to floor and have one panel cut on a power saw to make a door in that panel. Take the quarter-round, lay out the size of the closet on floor and ceiling, and nail the two panels in place. Attach hinges to door and set the latch. Scraps of plywood may be used for shelving inside the closet, with a pole of 3/4-inch galvanized pipe for the rack to hang clothes.

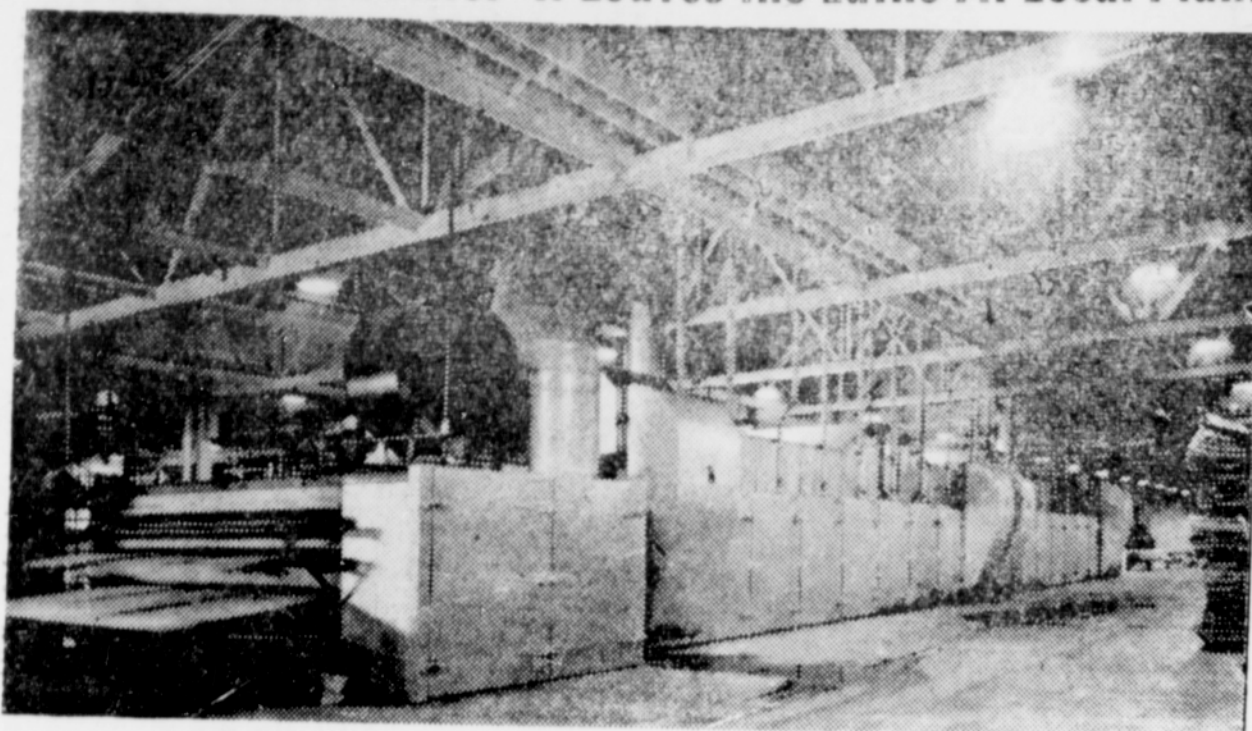
It's just that simple—and anyone who can use tools can install at practically little cost—just the materials.

Veneer Is Dried After It Leaves the Lathe At Local Plant



From the lathe the green veneer is first cut to various sizes, eliminating any "bad spots" and then is put through these dryers, pictured above. From the moment a log is brought in to the plant from the pond there is practically no "lost motion" until that log is made into plywood panels four by eight feet in dimensions. Manufacture of plywood is an interesting process to watch by the average citizen.
