

Bank Sets Opening For Next Saturday

Oregon State Bank will officially open its doors for business to the banking public Saturday morning, May 10, at 10 o'clock. This will make quite an event in the history of Brookings as the city has been without banking facilities since 1934.

Regular banking hours will be: 10 a. m. to 3 p. m. daily, with exception of Saturdays when the bank will be open until noon.

However, for the convenience of the banking public on its opening day, the bank has arranged to remain open until 5:00 p. m. that particular day.

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation has approved the bank for insurance under its supervision wherein each commercial and each saving account will be insured up to the maximum amount of \$10,000.

The board of directors, as recently elected by the stockholders, consist of Frank E. Langer, W. L. Crissey, Edwin Sund, Robert O. Dimmick, Wilson Freeman, A. R. Bergman and E. L. Morton.
