In the name of the Eisenhower-for-President committee, Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., chairman, issued the following statement, Saturday, May 10:

We fully realize the difficult and embarrassing task you will confront in choosing such a list from among the very many strong and worthy candidates who are on the ballot, but we are convinced that unless such a list is recommended by your Committee, the heavy Eisenhower majority vote will be dangerously scattered and diluted, and the concentrated minority vote for the Taft candidates might elect many of them. They should be defeated in their scheme of filing by petition to escape the moral and legal obligation of supporting the choice of the majority of the Oregon voters. The only way to defeat that scheme is to concentrate the majority Eisenhower vote on a list of candidates recommended by Oregon's own Eisenhower Campaign Committee."
