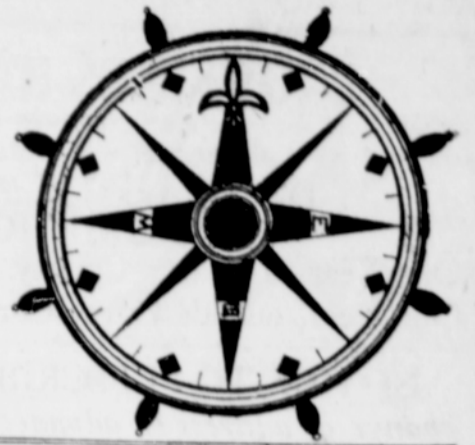

Applications Due For P. O. Position

Applications for permission to take the examination for postmaster of Brookings post office must be filed with the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, 25, D. C., by June 10, a bulletin has announced.

The forms to be filed include: Standard Form 124 (application form—formerly CSC Form 15); Physical fitness form 13; Admission Card Form X46-80; Standard Form 15 (veteran preference claim—formerly CSC Form 14, if you wish to claim veteran preference.

These may be obtained from the Civil Service Commission at Washington, D. C.

A written examination, with date and place appearing on the cards, will be held later.
