Cost Of History Explained; Book Larger Than Originally Planned For \$5. Each

"A Century of Coos and Curry," pioneer history, is now being distributed. To clear up some misunderstanding of the price, this statement is being published. The original contract with the publishing house called for a 500-page book to sell for \$5.00. Several hundred orders were taken at this price, to be used in obtaining bank loans to pay for the printing.

After cutting the material prepared as much as seemed wise, there remained a 631-page book, including pictures, with a \$6.00 price. The cost of 3000 books when ready for delivery, not including freight, expense of delivery and sales, and Dean Power's expense accounts for trips to Coos and Curry, in connection with editing (not yet received) is shown:

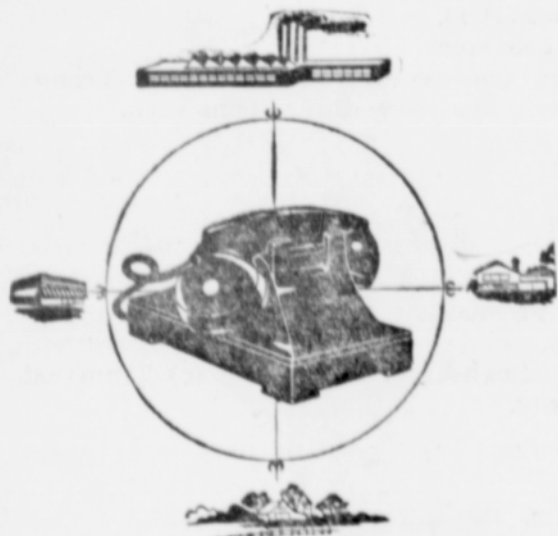

No Cherries Will Cross 'State Line'

California department of agriculture, through the bureau of plant quarantine, has issued a notice stating that no cherries will be allowed to be taken into California from Oregon this year. The statement read:

"That's right, we know you like 'em, and we don't blame you but don't bring 'em this year."

Here's the story: The southern Oregon counties are now under quarantine for the cherry fruit fly, which appears in cherries as a small white maggot. Infected cherries taken into this state (California) could readily spread this serious pest into the major cherry growing areas, where the crop is worth ten million dollars a year. None of us want this to happen."

To keep this pest from spreading, the state department of agriculture will prohibit the entry of those cherries until the pest threat is abated.

"We thought you'd like to know about this before you make plans for that cherry gathering expedition. Why not tell your neighbors about it?"
