

Lumber-Jacks Ran Over 'Beavers' Twice, 18 to 4 and 11 to 0, Last Sun.

Brookings Beavers absorbed a double shellacking on the local diamond, Sunday, as the "pro-studded Coos Bay-North Bend Lumber Jacks took both games of a double-header by the sizeable scores of 18 to 4 and 11 to 0.

The Jacks banged out a total of 38 hits for the afternoon, 23 in the opener and 15 in the nightcap.

Bob Astin, who had pitched a fine game against Bandon the previous Sunday, could not repeat in the first game and the Lumber Jacks routed him after Ken Jensen started the third inning with a home-run. Six runs had previously crossed the plate in the first and second. Keith Johnson came in as relief and was also hit hard although lack of support afield aided in the scoring.

Meanwhile Stan Blank, ace left-hander of Linfield College, had the Brookings batters pretty well under control. Don Jacobson and Bunky Peterson both beat out bunts to start the bottom of the third and Bob Astin unloaded a long home-run into left center, good for three runs. Wally Maciel, who had been safe with two down on a fielder's choice in the sixth, tallied on Phil Parson's triple. Jacobson and Peterson subsequently walked to load the bases but centerfielder Warren made a fine catch of Bob Astin's potential second home-run. These four hits were the only damage to Blank.

The second game was almost as one-sided as the first. Bill Wallace started on the mound for Brookings. Four hits, including two of the "fluke" variety, plus an error, promptly gave the visitors three runs. Wallace pitched one-hit ball for the next three frames but ran out of steam in the fifth and sixth as the Jacks got eight hits and eight runs. To his credit it must be said that the five runs in the sixth were unearned due to a costly error.

The Beavers could do nothing against the slants of Ward Rockey, ex-Western International League hurler, as he held them to three scattered hits, all singles by Bunky Peterson, Bill Darnell and Frank Burdell.

Big guns at the plate for the Lumber Jacks were first baseman Buzz Arlitt with 7 hits in 8 trips, Lou Scrivens, 7 for 9, Glen Stetter ex-WI league slugger 6 for 9 and Dick Wenner, ex-Portland Beaver, with 6 for 10. Bunky Peterson was the only Brookings batter with more than one hit for the day, getting two for five trips to the plate in two games.
