From there we drove out to the Salvation Home for Girls. There the grounds are like a fairy place, where every tree and shrub has a blossom, flowers of every description and color, tree ferns with trunks of five to six inches. Their tops are giant frond-like branches.

Then we went to the former royal palace which is in the middle of the Civic Center. Here, too, the grounds are most lovely, and words fail to explain their beauty. We walked through the palace with its lavish furnishings, hanging chandeliers of pure crystal prisms and the oriental rug which was like walking on deep moss.

From the palace we went out through a valley of palms and lush vegetation with blossoms of every conceivable color. Suddenly we came upon a breath-taking view: called the Pali, and over a sheer drop you view land and sea in the distance. Here the wind blows with a terrific force.

By the time we reached Pali, the car was fairly well-laden with different blossoms as our chauffeur guide had picked for us. We also visited the punch bowl crater wherein is located the Pacific National Memorial Cemetery for Hawaii's war dead and this is also where Ernie Pyle is buried. From here we drove back through beautiful residential districts and on to Waikiki Beach and to the Royal Hawaiian Hotel to have lunch. Lunch consisted of

chicken baked in cocoanut half-sells, sliced pineapple salad, hot rolls and dessert, with coffee.

During lunch there was a fashion show. Lovely models going in and out the tables.

Birds also make their home in

the dining salon, flying in and out the large open windows and about and over the tables, lighting on backs of chairs and occasionally on someone's shoulder for a bit of food.

After lunch we looked about the shopping arcada inside the hotel. In the ladies powder lounge the drapes were made of strung pearls and every detail was in tune with

the pearls.

After lunch we toured the farming country and out the beach drive along the cliffs and sea to Blow Hole, where the sea comes in under a huge reef and spouts water through a large crevice.

After driving through the beautiful beach homes and coming back the road skirts the water's edge, passing native taro patches, from

which the Hawaiian staple food 'poi' is made. The road is lined on both sides with beautiful hibiscus, oleander, banana groves. We visited a poi factory and camped it, which is a little similar to our potato.

On returning to our ship we surely felt as if had spent an enjoyable day and were tired.

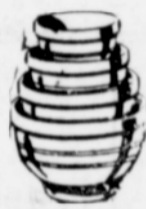

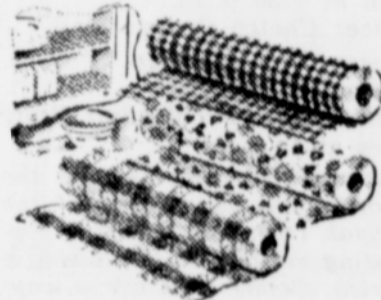
