EFFECT OF DRUGS on body tissues is recorded on the drum of the kymograph, which is shown above in operation under the supervision of research pharmacologist William I. Hazlett at the Nutrilite Research Laboratories in Buena Park, California. Hazlett puts tissues of experimental animals in a solution, then adds the drug to be tested. Reaction of the drug on the tissue is recorded on the slowly-revolving cylinder. The resulting recordings of the various drugs are later studied and their different reactions compared.
