

Goldsberry Named Director, Monday

At the annual school election on Monday, Virgil Goldsberry, who had served on the budget committee, and had been active in school affairs, was named for three years, to replace Gladys Kindel, resigned. The vote:

At the board re-organization, A. P. Hendricks was named board chairman, and will serve with Mr. Goldsberry and Mr. Crump.

At the close of the annual election, after notice of election of Virgil Goldsberry, appreciation was expressed to Mrs. Gladys Kindel, who was not a candidate for re-election, for her 20 years service to the district. This was brought to the board's attention by Warren Smith who complimented her on her unselfish record of public service, and said he doubted if it would ever be equalled again in

this district.

This service was continuous, except for three years during the war, while Mrs. Kindel was in Seattle.

The school has grown from three high school teachers and 33 pupils enrolled; and three grade teachers and 59 pupils, to a staff of 24 teachers and a total yearly enrollment (present year) of 683.

A. P. Hendricks, Harold Crump, present board members, Mrs. Dora Beaulieu, clerk, spoke of their appreciation of Mrs. Kindel's long service. Mrs. Garcia spoke for the school staff, and Mr. Hampton for the school.

Mrs. Kindel replied that her heart was still with District 17 and that she would be glad at any time to assist with the schools and problems.
