

### Beavers Lost Two in Sunday's Clash

Roseburg's Umpqua Chiefs handed Brookings two defeats on the local field Sunday, 13 to 5 and 1 to 0, the fifth straight double-header lost by the Beavers in the Southwestern Oregon league play.

The Chiefs got off to an easy start in the first of the opener, scoring three unearned runs on two hits and two errors. Vic Lapiner breezed through the second and third with no hits and no runs. Roseburg tagged him for six hits and six runs in the fourth, highlighted by Chuck Fisk's 3-run homer and Barney Koch's triple. The four runs of relief pitcher, Wally Maciel in the seventh were unearned due to a couple of costly infield errors.

The Beavers reached Bus Sporer, former Salem and Yakima WI league pitcher for 10 hits but never were able to bunch them effectively.

The seven-inning second game was probably the best ever seen on the local field, both teams playing errorless ball. Jim Nierman, OSC sophomore, in pitching a 3-hitter, certainly deserved a better fate. Chuck Fisk lead off with a walk, and was wild-pitched to second and third and later scored on

the lone tally on Ernie Blasquiz's double along left field line. Blasquiz also singled with two down in the sixth and George Sanders got the other hit off Nierman, an infield tap to the hole between third and short in the seventh.

Mickey Coen, freshman pitcher from Willamette University, also hurled a fine game, scattering the eight Brookings hits, striking out seven, without a pass.

Brookings' best scoring chance came in the sixth. With two down Vic Lapiner singled sharply thru the box. Frank Burdell followed with another hit, Lapiner going to third and Burdell taking second on the throw-in to third. Bill Darnell went in to pinch-hit for Keith Johnson and with two strikes on him swung at a wide pitch, driving it right at Blasquiz to end the threat.

The Beavers finish the first round of league play with a double-header against the Coquille Loggers here next Sunday. The Loggers split with Coos Bay-North Bend over the week-end, taking the Saturday night tilt, 5 to 4 in 10 innings but lost Sunday, 6 to 1.

Drain took undisputed possession of first place by dumping Bandon twice, 3 to 1 and 4 to 2, thus giving the Black Sox eight wins against only two losses, the latter at the hands of Coos Bay-North Bend.
