### PROCLAMATION

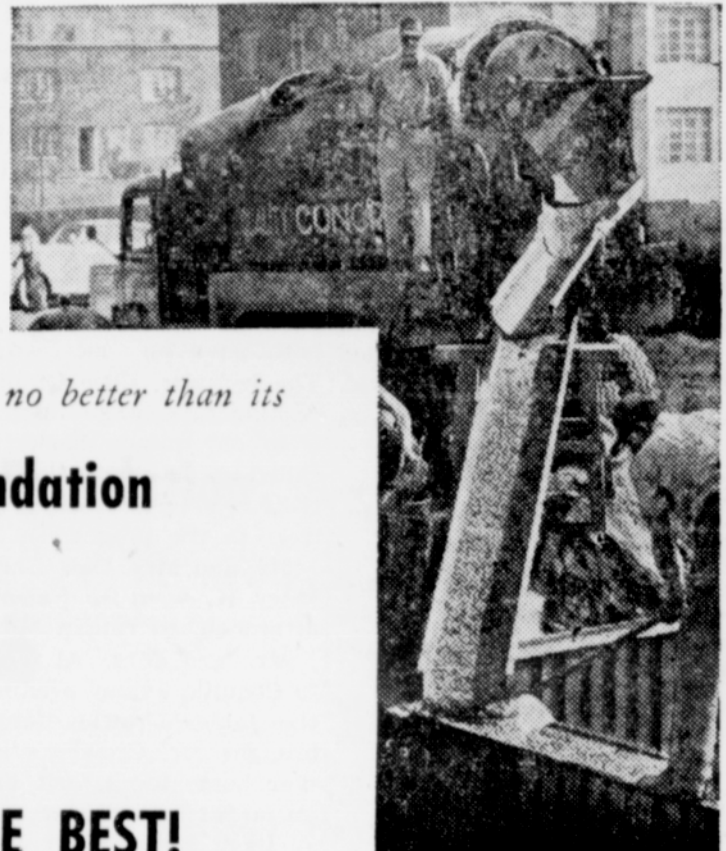
WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in the judgment of the State Forester, a menace to life and property due to conditions tending to cause or allow the rapid spread of fires which might occur or because of the inaccessible character of such areas due to the lack of suitable roads and WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester, it appears to me to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas designated as: Area No. R-1: All National Forests in Oregon and adjacent areas protected by the United States Forest Service as follows: Adjacent to Siskiyou National Forest: Section 31, T. 32 S., R. 8 W.; Section 36, T. 32 S., R. 9 W.; Section 36, T. 33 S., R. 8 W.; Section 36, T. 34 S., R. 8 W.; Sections 7, 8, 9, 16, 17, 18, 19, 30, 31, T. 34 S., R. 11 W.; Section 36, T. 34 S., R. 13 W.; Section 36, T. 35 S., R. 8 W.; Sections 6, 7, 16 to 20 inclusive, 29 and 30, T. 35 S., R. 11 W.; S 1/2 Section 10, Sections 11 to 16 inclusive, S 1/2 Section 17, Sections 20, 29, 30 and 31, T. 35 S., R. 12 W.; Sections 4, 8, 9, 16, 17, and 18, T. 39 S., R. 12 W.; and those portions of Sections 1 and 12, T. 40 S., R. 7 W. lying east of Sucker Creek; Sections 3, 10, T. 41 S., R. 8 W.; Section 16, T. 41 S., R. 11 W.; Section 16, T. 41 S., R. 12 W. NOW, THEREFORE, I Douglas McKay, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-210, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, as amended by Chapter 252, Oregon Laws, 1945, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above-described areas to be unlawful and do hereby close said areas and the same shall be subject to use only upon condition that entrants shall comply with all of the following requirements or conditions: (1) To refrain from smoking while traveling in such areas. (2) To secure a permit issued by the forester or a fire warden before building a campfire other than at improved, designated and posted campgrounds on such areas. (3) To have as a part of his or her equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian and/or camping at improved, designated and posted campgrounds, tools as specified by the forester suitable for extinguishing fires. This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 30th day of June, 1952, and shall remain in full force and effect until and including the 31st day of December, 1952. Done at the Capitol in Salem, Oregon, this 25th day of June, 1952. s/ Douglas McKay, Governor; Attest, Earl T. Newbry, Secretary of State.
