

Beavers Break Into 'Win' Column, Sun. By Dividing Pair With Coquille Loggers

Brookings Beavers are holding their heads high this week. The reason: They won a league game, taking the nightcap of a double-header from the Coquille Loggers by a 4 to 1 score.

Left-hander Jim Nierman was the Beaver hero of the day. He got two hits, one of which was a double, scored two runs, scattered the seven Loggers hits, struck out six and did not walk a man. It was just compensation for his heart-breaking three-hit 1 to 0 defeat at the hands of Roseburg last week.

But for an error in the opening frame, Nierman would have had a shut-out. With two down via the "strike-out" route, Shortstop Dick Ament doubled past the bag at third and then scored for an unearned run as Lee Wert's bounder to short went for an error.

Fleet centerfielder Murry Via opened the Beaver half with a walk. Vic Lapiner followed with a sacrifice bunt toward third. Via continued to third on head-up base running when he saw that Third-baseman Harrington left the bag uncovered. Frank Burdell, the league's leading hitter, promptly drove in the tying run with a 2-base hit.

The Beavers scored what later proved to be the winning run in the second on Jim Nierman's infield hit and two Coquille errors. Two Brookings "insurance" runs were added in the fifth on Nierman's double, Via's single and Lapiner's double, the latter driving Starter Dick Gilson, UCLA pitcher, from the mound.

Jim Nierman, meanwhile, was turning in a string of goose-eggs. Only in the seventh did the Loggers threaten again. An error and two singles sandwiched between two strike-outs loaded the bases. The Brookings fans rose with a loud cheer as Bill Wallace hauled in Ament's high pop-up at second

for the final out of the game.

Coquille took the opener by a 4 to 0 score behind the 4-hit pitching of crafty left-handed Aldon Wilkie, formely with the Pittsburgh Pirates and the Oakland Oaks. Bib right-hander Jim Lowman, ex-Bremerton WI leaguer, made his first start in a Beaver suit and threw a better-than-average game. Errors by his mates allowed single unearned runs in the second and fourth innings.

Coquille slammed in two of the earned variety in the third. With two down Joe Marchand singled. Left-hand hitting First Baseman Dave Douglas with the outfield pulled to the right, then hit to left center with the ball rolling across the road for a home run and two scores. Lowman pitched shutout ball the last five innings.

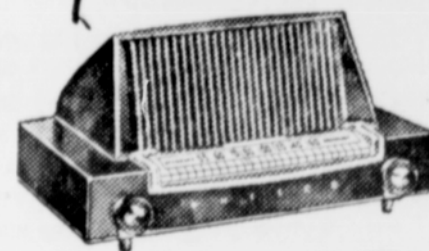
