### Court 'Upholds' City Ordinance

The decision of Judge Hans G. Nelson of the municipal court of Brookings in a case decided some months ago, was sustained by the Circuit Court when the matter came before that court on a Writ of Review, last Friday, July 12.

The case is one where the defendant was charged with operating a vehicle in the City of Brookings while under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

Following the sentence imposed by Judge Nelson, the defendant petitioned the Circuit Court for a Writ of Review of the Proceedings and sentence had in Judge Nelson's court on the grounds that there was an error in such proceedings.

The Circuit Court found that there was no error in the proceeding, and sustained the sentence of the municipal court
